## REV. G. C. CARPENTER TALKS TO GOSPEL TEAM

Hagerstown Pastor and Trustee of College Gives Interesting Address

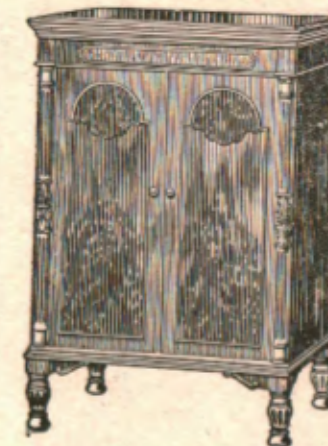
