(6) That there was absolutely no necessity for the cancellation of the debts, and lastly, (7) There is a better, more just and wiser plan to pursue. This better plan was the constructive plan of the negative that the U. S. should, in place of cancelling the debts, "Expend what sums were necessary and expedient thus winning the right to influence and command for the improvement of Europe."

According to the point system by which the debate was judged the team at Defiance lost by the narrow margin of three points. Both teams scored between them a total of three hundred-sixty points, Defiance having three more points than Ashland.
