Eager response has been made to the appeal to spend this week while Rev. E. C. Miller is here in an attitude of religious contemplation and devotion. Meetings are more than ordinarily well attended and a zeal is in evidence which speaks well for the religious ideas that have been inculcated in the students here. Ashland enjoys an unique distinction among colleges in Ohio. The present "Week of Religion" will do much toward keeping those ideals for which she was founded untrammelled.
