DR. MACKEY PREACHES AT SUNDAY CHAPEL

"Wisdom of God"--Theme

Dr. Mackey a former member of the Faculty of Ashland College, preached the sermon in the Chapel last Sunday morning. His topic was "The Wisdom of God."

He began his sermon by saying that all wise people are nto good. The Greeks wise people are not good. The Greeks wisdom is with God so is God's wisdom foolishness with men," he said in explaining. He said that God passed the wise people by and chose the common intellects of life to work out his manifestations.

In speaking of the relation of God to man, he said, "Just as a failing business man takes a partner to keep from bankruptcy, so should we take Christ as our partner when we face the rough places of life." "The guilty man wants God for he is continually seeking something which will make him clean and pure and true in God's sight. He wants a mind greater than his own which will tell him when to do right and how to do it." He went on to show how the mighty minds of the world have been built up by a mere sensual intellectual process have forgotten God and fallen.

He concluded by explaining the philosophy of Christ's gospels. "Just as the Greek Philosophy had three elements, so did the Philosophy of Christ have three elements, Righteousness, Sanctification and Redemption." "These three are by far greater than any other philosophy ever was," he said in closing.
