

Panthers Drop Before Varsity

Eshelman kicked a weak one to Baylor who grabbed it and ran four yards. A bad pass lost Ashland four yards and Fox ran thru center for nine as the quarter ended. Score—Ashland, 7; Orrville, 0.

SECOND QUARTER.

Weber punted out of bounds on Orrville's thirty-nine yard line. Two line plays and an end run gained but five yards for the visitors and Eshelman punted to Curry on Ashland's fifteen yard line. Curry ran three yards and slipped and was downed on the eighteen yard line. Wharton made four at right tackle. Fox made six at center and three at left guard. An Ashland pass failed. Fox failed to gain at right guard. Weber punted to Beck who was downed in his tracks. Beck scampered at right end for three. Coyer bit off a yard at right tackle. A pass flunked and Eshelman punted to Curry on the twelve. Curry returned thirteen yards. Fox made four at right guard. Curry made two at right tackle. Weber ran the extremity of the line for six. Wharton made two at right tackle. Weber ran left end for three and first down. Curry chewed off five at right tackle and Fox made first down thru center. Wharton hit the line for six and O'Neal who replaced Fox made first down at right tackle. O'Neal made two at center and Curry slipped off right tackle for seven. O'Neal made first down again thru center. Weber made ten around left end as the half ended. In this time Ashland had marched from their own twelve yard line to Orrville's nine yard line, a distance of seventy-nine yards in fourteen plays. Score—Ashland 7, Orrville 0.

THIRD QUARTER.

Norris kicked to Beck on the eighteen yard line and Rupert nailed him in his tracks. Orrville was penalized fifteen for holding. This put the ball on their three yard line. Beck punted out of bounds but the ball was brought back and Ashland penalized five yards for off-sides. Orrville punted again, an Ashland man touched the ball making it a free ball. Orrville recovered on the twenty-seven yard line. Orrville was penalized five for off sides and on the next play punted to Curry who returned eight. Fox made five thru right guard. Curry made first down at right tackle. Fox made four at right tackle and

lost out at center. Weber ran right end for four. Fox made two at center. Weber ran left end for two. Ashland passed twice and the second was intercepted by an Orrville man on his own two yard line.

Beck punted to Curry who made five before he was downed. Curry then called into action the Murray shift and made five off right tackle. Using the same play Fox followed the crowd and walked for seven off left tackle. Wharton ran right end for six and Weber ran left end for four. Fox was sent at center and made five. Curry made four at left guard. Wharton following the shift stepped across for a touchdown. Fox kicked goal from placement.

Eshelman kicked a lazy one to Norris who carried it five yards. Weber hit the line for six. Wharton hit left tackle and gained four. Curry sneaked thru center for four. Fox made three at right tackle. Weber made three at left tackle and Fox cracked center for eight as the quarter ended.

FOURTH QUARTER.

Curry opened the last period with a neat run off right tackle for seven and added one at left guard. Fox hit left tackle for three and first down. Wharton made four at right tackle. Fox made one at center. Weber lost four when Shoemaker playing a star game for the Panthers at end slipped in and tackled him. Curry tried a pass that failed on the fourth down.

Beck punted to Curry who was downed with no gain. Fox made five at guard. Orrville was penalized for off-sides. Weber made eight and Curry made first down. Fox made one at left tackle and added three at center. Curry threw a nice pass to Schmuck that gained twenty-four yards, with the ball on the visitors' twelve yard line two plays failed and a pass by Weber was intercepted by Ryan on his own seven yard line. Rupert threw Coyer for a loss and the ball was then in Orrville's possession on their nine yard line. Beck punted to Weber who was tackled by Shoemaker. With the ball on the five yard line Fox hit right tackle with no gain and Curry made four at the same hole. Curry made two at center and on the next play threw a pass to Schmuck who nabbed it over the goal line.

In the remaining time Ashland kicked off to Orrville and the Panthers returned with a punt. Ashland made a first down and Curry passed to Rupert for another first down as the game ended. Score—Ashland, 21; Orrville, 0.
