

Also owned shares in the NANCY, SCIENCE and SQUANDO, three privateers of the War of 1812. Probably the profits made in the NANCY were lost when invested in the SCIENCE and SQUANDO, as the two latter were lost before any prizes were made.







In 1806, he had two large cargoes, one of 105,610 pounds of sugar, 4,280 pounds of coffee and 4,204 pounds of cocoa and the other, 8,000 gallons of rum, 22,000 pounds of coffee and 46,576 pounds of sugar. This was the peak with the end only four years away.




Altho Charles Cushing began his commercial activities while living in South Berwick, it was not until he moved to Portsmouth in 1821 that he became a powerful factor in this State. Molasses and sugar were the items around which he built his foreign trade to which he added at various times such rum, coffee, tobacco, cocoa, earthenware, crockery, salt, coal etc. The year 1827 was his best and during that one year, he imported 190,000 gallons of molasses, 76,000 pounds of sugar, 25,000 pounds of coffee, 100 gallons of rum, 3250 cigars, 2300 ox horns, 1,750 bushels of coal and straw carpeting.

His biggest year was his last, the year 1828, importing 15,535 gallons of molasses, 187,477 pounds of sugar, 24,421 pounds of cotton and 3,673 bushels of salt.

He was the sole owner of the Privateer Bg. GEN. SULLIVAN of 14 guns and 100 men, which vessel captured the Ship MARY of 8 guns and recaptured the Ship HARRIET that had been cut out of Gloucester by the enemy and taken to sea. He was also sole owner and master of the Privateer WHITE OAK of 6 guns and 15 men.

He also built the Ship ARCHELAUS of nearly 500 tons at Exeter in three years. The largest vessel built in this section for fifty years. Sold to Scott of Boston and lost off Cape Cod.

Another big year was 1796 when he brought in 107,000 pounds of sugar, 5,500 gallons of rum and 70,000 pounds of coffee from the West Indies and South America, and merchandise from Europe valued at \$14,000. He reached his height in sugar in 1811 when he imported 275,000 pounds. After the War of 1812, he traded with the West Indies until 1824 but he did not reach his former place.



During the War of 1812, was captain of the Portsmouth Privateer THOMAS, capturing the DROMO valued at \$325,000 and the DIANA valued at \$203,000. He also captured the Nova Scotia Privateer LIVERPOOL PACKET which was doing considerable damage along the New England coast. He, in turn, was captured September 29, 1813, by the British Frigate NYMPH off Cape North and held prisoner. Released, he assumed command of the Privateer PORTSMOUTH of 270 tons and was recaptured November 7, 1814. His greatest prize, possibly was his passenger Rebecca Sampson when he landed at Portsmouth July 6, 1824, for ^{shortly} ~~sirtly~~ after, she became his wife.

He was made Captain of the Revenue Cutter PORTSMOUTH in 1830 and served until 1833 when he became captain of the Revenue Cutter MADISON on being assigned to the Portsmouth Custom House. Thomas M. Shaw died April 6, 1836.
