

A complex of 5 brick buildings including the original 3-story brick building with cupola facing the South Millpond; two perpendicularly-placed buildings to its left and the power plant behind it - all built in a similar Colonial Revival style, and the modern brick building to the left and in front of the original building.

The original building has 3 stories with a hip roof and central cupola, graduated corner quoins, Ionic entry portico flanked by windows set in blind arches, and tall arcuated window (as per stair landing) between the second and third stories. Originally connected by hyphens to 2-story wings on either side (5x2 bays), the hyphens and wings were later raised to those stories and a further 3-story wing added on the left end (wood on the third story - an enclosed porch). The five buildings to the left have 3 stories with central, gabled pavilions, the latter with four concrete palmette pilasters; the rear of the two buildings has a cupola. The front building has received a modern entry porch and its left side now connects to a recent T-plan modern building of four stories (plus basement) with facade consisting of vertically ridged precast section (with windows) on the left and strip windows on the right; there is an additional basement story on the facade, the building being set into the hillside.

The power plant is a 1-story brick building with hip roof and monitor atop that; it is set into the hillside and therefore has a loading dock on the second story in the front.
