Description:

A 2½ story, gable roofed brick rowhouse block of three units dating from the mid-nineteenth century. Boxed cornice. Segmentally arched window heads (brick), granite sills. Although the window sash is in the process of being replaced by 6/6 sash, some remaining 2/2 may represent the original. Doors in second, fourth, sixth and eight bays, all arcuated except for the one in the fourth bay, which has a rectangular granite lintel. Cut granite foundation. Iron tie rod fastenings visible at line of division between stories. Shutters indicated by some surviving shutter hooks, two chimneys on rear slope of roof, between units. Rear wall shows flashing and tar remaining from one story gable roofed sheds over each door.

Turned brick cornice on rear.
