An L-shaped plan with the long side of the main block toward the street. Also, a small one story shed on the East side in the back. This $2\frac{1}{2}$ story double house has projecting one story bays on either side of the four-bay facade, with doors betwee, covered by a hip-roofed porch. Above this, the two middle windows are smaller than the others. The chimneys are small and located on the ridge of the roof. Sash is 2/2 and probably original. The projecting bays also appear original, as do the single-light doors. The house is a fairly typical and well-preserved example of c. 1890-1910 architecture.
