



The original part of this house is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story gable roofed Gothic Revival cottage with a cross gable in the middle of the facade. It is pictured in a painting in the Rundlet-May House on Middle Street. To this was added, a much larger $2\frac{1}{2}$ story Tudor Revival section, shingled on the first story and half-timbered above.

It is one of Portsmouth's most interesting and unusual examples of the combination of complementary styles from different periods (far more common in the city is the combination of Federal and Colonial Revival styles).



This is a two story brick church building built as an auditorium plan. Nearly square (but adapted to an irregular corner site), the building has a full Doric entablature with parapet above. Below, on each side, are five bays, the central three inset, with engaged Tuscan columns between them. These bays have window enframements extending through two stories with semicircular heads. The sides have pilasters instead of columns. The curvilinear iron door hood with antefixae (corner roof decorations on classical buildings) is typically Beaux Arts in conception.

Significance:

Although a familiar architectural style by virtue of having been used in many post offices and other government buildings in the 1930s, the Beaux Arts classical style is fairly unusual in a church of this period, and unique in the Portsmouth area.



sophisticated and powerful expression of local resources in the mid
19C.



A three story Federal house with delicate Federal cornice and low third story. The house is unusual in having an L-plan, giving it a very impressive appearance from Haymarket Square, as the facade and left side each present five bays. The windows have architrave window heads and projecting cornices, probably dating from the mid-19C. The front doorway appears to have been altered at the same time, receiving large double doors and a transom light, while the porch on the left side may date from then or later (note that its foundation, while granite, differs from that of the house). Chimneys are located on the right side and on the ridge of the ell toward the front.

Significance:

A very impressive three story Federal house, unusual for its size and plan, seemingly adapted to its prominent location.





This large two story yellow brick house was built for Wallace Hackett in 1892 on the site of an earlier house demolished sometime between 1877 and 1890. The house has a central entry fronted by a columnar porch with a three part window above. The doorway has a fanlight over sidelights. To either side is a large bowed bay, recalling Boston rowhouses of the early 19C, each with two windows above and below. The stone lintels are splayed. There are three roof dormers, the central one having a broken scroll pediment, the others triangular pediments (as with the single dormers on the sides). The roof is slate.

Significance:

The house was designed by Ball and Dabney, architects, of Boston, a firm with Portsmouth connections which did other work in the Seacoast area (spec.: York, ME). It is an outstanding example of late 19C Colonial Revival architecture. Converted to a Masonic Lodge in the 1920s, the house remains virtually unchanged inside and out, and in excellent condition. A large classical auditorium was added to the rear c. 1930.



The five bay facade has a central fanlighted doorway with 2/3 sidelights, fronted by a portico with lintel Tuscan columns of attenuated proportions. The exterior is clapboarded and sits above a cut granite and brick foundation. Connected to the main block are woodsheds, privy stable and carriage house in a L shaped plan. The carriage house is two stories with hipped roof and oculus over the facade door. The stable and sheds are one story with arched openings with keystones to the stalls.

Significance:

A well documented mansion built by merchant James Rundlet probably to designs by Ebenezer Clifford of Exeter, the carvings are by William Deering and the front fence by joiner James Nutter. The property is an architectural landmark and preserved by the SPNEA.

A 2 story mid Georgian house with five bay facade, hip roof, three front dormers, balustrade at roof curb level. The dormers have projecting pediments, triangular on either side and segmental in the middle. The heavy console cornice has a bed molding which breaks forward above the windows. The lower windows have triangular pediments, while the (presently deeply inset) doorway is flanked by Corinthian pilasters supporting a full entablature with bolection fireze, and segmental pediment with curved consoles (and moldings breaking forward above the pilasters).

A two story wing on the right side is set back about 4" on second story and about 2' on the first story, the latter topped by a full entablature and flanked by a Tuscan column and half column. The main cornice of this section continues that of the main block of the house. This wing may be Greek Revival (at least in part) and contemporary with alterations to the doorway.

There is another, one story, wing extending right from the rear corner of the first (numbered 599A). It has three bays marked off by flat arches and is, in fact, the former carriage house converted into living space. It was attached to the house after both were moved.
