



Be it ordained by the City of Portsmouth, Council assembled as follows:

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force beginning August 19, and including the week up to August 23, governing the streets in the city as follows:

Parrott Ave., one way street, entering from Richards Ave., exit, Rogers St., and Junkins Ave.

No parking on streets during the above dates from new bridge, including Daniel, Congress and Islington streets up to Aldrich Road, Aldrich Road to Middle; from new bridge to State to Middle; Middle to Lafayette Road to the arch on Lafayette Road; from Congress to State on Middle St.

No parking on State St. from Middle to Cass on August 20.

No parking on the entire length of the following

shreets: Pleasant, Junkins Ave., Richards Ave., Miller Ave., Wibird St., and Willard Ave.

No parking on South St.

No traffic allowed on South St., from Lafayette Road to the junction of Miller and Sagamore Avenues from 7:00 to 11:00 P. M., Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, August 21, 22, and 23; also from the hours of 1:00 to 5:00 P. M., on Wednesday, August 22.

No parking on Vaughn St., New Vaughn St., Maple-wood Ave., to Dennett St.

No parking on the entire length of Court St.

No parking on Water St., Monday, August 20.

No parking on cross streets between Court, Middle,

Bridge, Deer, Market, Bow and Waterfront during the day of Monday, August 20.

Any person violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed ten dollars.
