Description:

A 5-bay, $2\frac{1}{2}$ story gable-roofed Italianate house. Two inset stove chimneys on rear roof slope near ridge. Central projecting open porch (arches on posts) 1st floor. Door has transom lights and may have had side lights. Central pavilion gives monumental appearance to street facade of an otherwise standard house type. Additions as noted above and a broad (4 x 1 bays) $2\frac{1}{2}$ story gable-roofed ell on the rear, with stove chimney in center. This ell is very Greek Revival in appearance and totally different from (but possibly contemporary with) street facade.
