8.Outbuildings:

Description:

A two story brick school building built in , Whipple School has a cut granite foundation and hip roof (covered with slate). It has two large chimneys with corbelled tops, located at the tops of the side roof slopes. Other features include the corbel-table brick cornice, rectangular granite lintels and sills and Richardsonian arched entry trimmed with hammer dressed voussoirs of staggered length. To this main block was added a two story wing on the left which continues – in concrete – the window trim of the original, but has a projecting classical cornice with stepped parapet above (typical Beaux Arts classicism of c. 1900–1935); in the corner, facing front, is an enclosed entry with double doors and a large Federal Revival fanlight. The wing and its one story rear ell are set on a poured concrete foundation.

Gurney states that Haven School was built in 1846, being the first school in Portsmouth with more than two rooms and, further, that "... whatever attempt at ornamentation there is about it is due to its recent remodelling."
