## Description:

Originally a center-hall one room deep plan with end chimneys (1 now Tost) plus full rear-ell, the ell (perhaps originally a 1725 era building) was partly destroyed. The house now faces High Street with 5-part facade and center triangular pediment, Georgian doorway with plain pilasters and transom below entablature. Roof gabled with hip at present NE corner joining ell remnant. Sash all 6/6, no windows present W end except pair in attic. Arched stair-landing window center rear over 1-story (new ?) shed joining original rear door to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story ell. Two windows each floor ell side, one window each floor rear plus two new sash to 1st floor ell and connector.

## Significance:

The house is noted for its fine Georgian stair hall with its original staircase and arched stair landing window case, all of which was recorded by H.A.B.S. in the 1930s. This woodwork may be the work of Michael Whidden, Jr., a joiner, the first owner.
