

ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL

The St. Luke's Hospital, is the name of a new institution in this city, which is designed to fill a long felt want here. It has been established through the good work of Rev. C. Le V. Hays, rector of the Christ church and it is located in the Parish House, connected with the church.

There are at the present time rooms for seven patients and if it is successful, additional accommodations may be secured. The hospital is not established to run in opposition to either the Portsmouth Hospital or the Whitehead Hospital for Chronic cases but is rather intended to take

such cases as can not be handled in either of these two institutions, and it will have its place among the most worthy charities of the city.

Dr. F. S. Towle, and Dr. E. B. Eastman are the physicians in charge and it has opened with three patients.

In addition to the rooms on Madison street, the house off Myrtle avenue, which was purchased and fitted up for a hospital, some years ago, will be available for special cases, so that from now on this city will be well equipped to take care of every kind of a case in the three institutions.
