



The inset entry has a heavy Greek Revival door surround and  $\frac{1}{2}$  sidelights. The door itself is c. 1900 with large glass panel in upper half. The house is transitional Federal/Greek Revival in style; in plan it resembles two houses on Gardner Street and one on Marcy near Gardner with similar chimney arrangement. This house has a brick foundation and 6/6 sash; the interior has been extensively altered.



A  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -story gable-roofed Federal house with two rear chimneys, of which the right one is visible. The plan - 2/2 plan with central hall and real chimneys - is a typical Fdedral one of c. 1810-20, and the cove window cornices on the end windows are typical of the period. However, the architrave window heads with projecting cornices on the first story windows of the facade are late Greek Revival in style, as is the inclosed entry porch; the latter has pilastered corners, side windows with architrave surrounds, and a doorway with transom light and 3/5 sidelights. The door itself has applied palmetto decorations (modern?).

There are chimneys on the ridge - right and left ends. Stylistically, the house shows the combination of Queen Anne, Shingle Style and Colonial Revival (lunette window) typical of the 1890s and for some time thereafter. Could also be characterized as Early Bungalow, despite its height.



Two story hip roofed Federal house, with an L-shaped plan and a five bay, central entry facade. The house is unusual in several respects: It has a central chimney (as well as one in the ell) and is set on a high brick foundation with a stone base, although the foundation may have been heightened. The style appears to be early Federal due to cove cornices on the first story windows and the door surround which has pilasters extending up through the entablature.

The one story hip roofed porch on the center and left side of the facade has turned posts, extended eaves and a classical entablature, and probably dates c. 1900.

The rubble stone wall with rough cut granite plinth along the right side of the yard is notable. The  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story gable roofed barn with bargeboards must date from the late 19C.

Five bay facade with double doors and gable-roofed porch, the whole entry arrangement apparently 20C. Flush gable eaves (no projection).

The double windows on the sides appear to be late alterations.

Large  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -story Queen Anne style house with gable roof and two story gable-roofed ell in center of rear (with one story hip-roofed porch - probably original to left of ell in corner).

The facade consists of three bays with projecting polygonal bays on either side, two stories, surmounted by oversize, assymetrical wall dormers with fishscale shingle covering). A one story porch with paired columns on parapets and surmounting balustrade fronts the doorway, which is a broad classical element with oversize, flanking 2/3 sidelights. Sash is 2/1 and diamond pane / 1 (Queen Anne).

Interesting house of its type, preserving most of its original details.
