Dear Mr. Haldeman:

I have at hand your letter of March 25th and appreciate the interest which you have taken in getting the blue print of tracks in the vicinity of our plant laid out.

There are two or three points that I would like to have cleared up, namely:

In the first place I think you will find, as stated to you when here, that the tracks across your main line from our plant and running through our property, used for storage for empty cars, is our own property from the point of switch to the end of these tracks.

We are also somewhat uncertain as to the exact condition of your right of way through our plant and up as far as Tenth Avenue. Would it be possible for you to submit us copies of your title records on this right of way.

Also, according to our understanding, there is only one track inside our plant on which you have actual easement rights. If you have any claim on any other tracks on such a basis we do not know. If you have, would you kindly send us copies of such documents and, in fact, send us a copy of any easement right that you may have inside our plant.

I presume you have copy of this blue print and am, therefore, not returning same to you.
