

Sitting in my law office window in the Southern Building, looking out (in my mind's eye) over the White House toward the balance of the country, things occur to me of passing interest. I like to jot them down.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 7 .- TO MY MILLION AND MORE READERS: This is WINDOW SEAT No. 520. There are 52 weeks in a year, and 10 times 52 is 520—exactly 10 years old this week. More readers today than ever before. I estimate more than two million people read The WINDOW SEAT each week.

Interesting pastime, isn't it? I often wonder why so many do read it. Here is a paragraph from a letter received a few minutes ago: "Here is your check for \$2.50 (damn it). Of course I agree with you that the WINDOW SEAT is not worth this large amount. Nevertheless, I cannot resist the temptation to find out what you are going to say next time, and the next, and the next."

Here is a quotation from a woman, a complete stranger to me: "Dear Friend: I have been reading your WINDOW SEAT reflections so long in the weekly Mena (Ark.) Star that I have come to regard you a dear friend. Many are wishing you would be our next President. With your name on the ticket no one else need run."

This friend's enthusiastic letter illustrates the danger in which many of our present day office holders find themselves. So many give them such exaggerated estimates that they lose their vision—they can't see straight, and they don't keep their feet on the ground. I have seen many government executives who, when they finally got into office, felt they were especially called of the Almighty for that particular place. Instead of being especially called, it usually seemed to me they might have slipped in when the Almighty wasn't looking. While I am grateful for this sort of enthusiasm, yet I never expect to be a candidate for office again.

There is another class of people I have heard about whose virtues are terribly exaggerated. "Probably the greatest man that ever lived was Skinner-broad-minded, big-hearted, and brilliant, yet he died with all his talent unsuspected." "How did you come to find out about him?" "I married his widow."

The WINDOW SEAT letters that appeal to me the most strongly are the ones from young people. All kinds of requests. Can't begin to keep up with them.

1.-KNOW GOD. This will take eternity, but work at it every day. It pays big dividends.

2.—Take your pencil and make a big letter "I." At the top, immediately after it, put "ntegrity"; immediately below this put "ndustry"; immediately below this put "nitiative."

When Ed Meredith was Secretary of Agriculture he gave me this illustration which he used many times in his talks to boys and girls, those three words—INTEGRITY, INDUSTRY, INIT-IATIVE—when applied to our lives are bound to make us succeed.

This is especially true if we refuse to place inflated values on material things and the means of acquiring them, and if, when we are knocked down into the gutter and cut to pieces by adversity we pick up the pieces, and put them together again, and face life full of faith and self confidence.

In any event it doesn't pay us to whine and cry about things. Little Johnny was gazing at his one-day-old brother who lay squealing and wailing in his cot. "Has he come from heaven?" asked Johnny. "Yes, dear." "No wonder they put him out."

In commenting on the Supreme Court decision last week knocking out NRA, President Roosevelt said the Court had put us back into the "horse and buggy age." I can't believe this is what the President meant to say. The country is not back there. The country wants labor to get its full and fair share of what it produces, the country doesn't want child labor and the sweat shops, the country wants old age pensions and other social security, the country wants farm relief, the country wants automobiles and radio and electricity and all the modern things. No, probably he meant to suggest the idea that this great Court, composed of nine distinguished old gentlemen, is in the horse and buggy age.

Of course we can get too far ahead of the good old things to be comfortable. The daughter excitedly exclaimed, as the radio ground out the last notes of the latest thing in jazz, "Did you ever hear anything so perfectly wonderful?" "No," replied dad, "I can't say I have, although I once heard a collision between a truck load of empty milk cans and a freight car filled with live ducks."

Times have changed since this famous old Constitution was adopted, nearly a century and a half ago. Then, the news of this Supreme Court decision would probably have not reached New York much short of a week. While the decision was being read, I got a telephone call from an associate lawyer in New York asking whether the decision was comprehensive, or whether it knocked out the NRA solely because Congress had delegated legislative power to the President. I called the Suprme Court Clerk, who gave me the information. I then called my New York associate back and told him what the decision was, even while Chief Justice Hughes still was reading it. This evidently is a long ways from


