On 18th, day of June, by request of Commissioner McPhaul, the Health Nurse, and myself visited Fannie Williams and Lula Williams indigents who lived about twelve miles from Loxley, across the River Styx. We recommend that they be brought to the house four miles south of Bay Minette, recently acquired by the county, that they might be better cared for.

Mrs. Taylor, Health Nurse, and myself have since made several visits to them at the Alms House above referred to, pending permanant arrangments for treatment of such immates.

I will take occasion to say here, that as there seems to be, in the minds of some, an idea that the Health Unit is required by Law to treat, clinnically, certain classes of persons; viz., indigent persons, and those confined in county institutions, I will give you here a few sections from the Law, and the Manual Regulating Health Work.

Annual Roll Call Amendment, petition filed June 1, 1925.

Add as section 6, of Art. e, relating to membership, as Follows:

The secretary shall each year make a revision of the list of non-resident members, writing on or before the 15th of January, by registered mail to the given address of each non-resident member, who has not been heard from officially since the beginning of the preceding year, requesting a verification of his address; and any members from whom no reply is received before Dec. 31st of such year shall be dropped from the list; provided that any member who has been so dropped shall be reinstated, upon his application therefor, reported by the Secretary to the Executive Council.





Dear Lessee:-

The Tax Assessor has announced his rounds for assessing property for taxation for the year 1931, which will bring him to Fairhope, October 15th and 16th and again on October 28th.

Under the law it is the duty of every taxpayer to appear before the Assessor and return his property for taxation; but if not in the county he may appoint some one as his agent to do so for him.

Your attention is called to clause three of your lease, reproduced herewith; especially to the last sentence.

(3) In consideration of the payment of the rents herein provided for, the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation agrees with the said lessee to pay all taxes levied by county and state upon the land herein described and on receipt of the County Treasurer's receipt for taxes paid by him upon the improvements and other personal property held upon such lands—moneys and credits excepted—to give him a certificate of equivalent amount, receivable from bearer at its face value on rent, or in the discharge of any indebtedness to the Corporation. Provided that said lessee will appoint whomsoever may be designated by the Corporation as his agent to return his property for taxation, where permitted by law so to do; and that in no event shall the Corporation be bound to pay taxes on any more than the fair valuation of the property, on the basis require by law.

If you will not be able to appear before the Assessor at one of his appointments, please so advise this Corporation, with the necessary information regarding your property, preferably copy of last assessment, and return will be made for you.

The interests of this Corporation and its lessees are so interwoven in this matter of assessments, the revenue of the Corporation being almost entirely derived from rentals and the greatest portion of that revenue being paid out in taxes, which mutual interest dictates that assessments shall not be in excess of what is required by law, so large a portion of taxes paid going out of the community to the County and State and so little of this finding its way back, that we deem some suggestions to you pertinent at the present time.

This corporation does not desire to avoid the payment of its fair and just proportion of taxes, but certainly does not desire to pay more.

Your attention is called to the fact, overlooked frequently, that the law only asks for assessments at 60 per cent of the real value of the property. \$600 on \$1,000, \$1200 on \$2.000, \$1500 on \$2,500, etc. And the assessor when he asks you the value of your property expects you to give him the 60 per cent which the law asks, not the full value from which he will take 60 per cent.

Further, in case of Colony leaseholds, you must never include anything for the land, as that is assessed by the Corporation as title-holder.

Also, many people, it is believed fail to make allowance for depreciation. A house 10 or 20 years old, especially if paint is in good condition, may look to casual observers as "good as new" but all of it has undergone deterioration, even if not visible. The foundation is likely impaired by decay, the roof is approaching need of replacement; it may have become unsuited to the locality or out of date as to architecture, in which case no one would be willing to pay for it anything like what it might have cost. Then money spent on repairs to a building should not be considered as adding to its value but simply as maintenance.

And furniture and fixtures, as soon as purchased and placed in a house or store, become second-hand and have money value only on that basis.

The law allows an exemption of \$150 to residents on household and kitchen furniture, hogs, sheep, cows, and calves, sewing machines, and \$100 each on farm and mechanical tools and poultry, deducted from full 100% value.

All these things and more should be taken into account in fixing assessible value and you are expected to give yourself the "benefit of any doubt." If you do not Fairhope assessments will be much above those of other places.

This was found to be the case this summer, when a move, resulting from activities of some local people, for an increase in the Colony's land assessment, caused an investigation which disclosed that Fairhope's total assessment of land, improvements and personal property—properly eliminating railroad and light and water plants—was more than 30 per cent greater than Bay Minette's and that the Colony alone, on its less than 40 per cent of Fairhope's area was paying on a higher assessment of land and improvements than the whole town of Bay Minette.

We hope that these considerations will move you to protect the Corporation and yourself, and fellow-lessees when returning your property for assessment, by not over-valuing it. If you fail to do so the Corporation will have to fall back on the protective provision in clause 3 of your lease.
