Tours of 3rd just at hand and I hasten ( for this time) to reply. I am glad to know of your continued interest in Pairhove—though I need not to have doubted that, and did not. I certainly wish you could visit Pairhove again and see what advances we have made since you were last here, but under the domination of the "plutes" railroad fares are so bish that common wolks can hardly afford to travel. I am expecting however, that others will some back into the Colony's bands in the near future. The Bal Park lots were promptly applied for and bonuses bid on musther a number of them, so there are none available there. There were a number only waiting for it to be opened up. We have quite a lot of land a little to the south of the ball mark, where a let can be obtained. It appears a little far off just now, but is really right in town and lays besutifully. Lots A, C & 10, of Blk. 47 have bay view and lay very prettily, and are open for application. The rent is 210.67 a year. The 17 to 20 are onen with exception of lots 11 and 14, and are just helf the rent of the lots 1 to 10. These however, have no view of the bay. They are nice big lots. There is a common fence about them and some of them are cleared. In which case there will be a charge for clearing of \$2.60 x 105.0 There also has to be vaid with each application a half year, a ren at current rating and a dollar for a leace.

My own advice is to not take a lot until you are ready to use it, but I enclose applications and will be glad to recise your application for any of those indicated if you want to get one at once. There are now houses on lot 3 and lot 4, which you used to have. There has for years been an unsatisfied demand for hay front lots and Ettel recently sold only a part of his wase, which you perhaps remember, for about \$17,000.

In the illustrated folder which I am mailing you will find information rewarding typical rentals. Just now there are very artificial values claimed for land hereabous according to fur view. For instance \$400 an acre is said to have been refused for land jau outside the Town limits, which nobody thought of being worth more that \$50 to \$100 a year or two aso, and in my opinion that wo ld be a good price for it now. Right across the street from it we rent land averaging better for about three dollars an acre a year and pay taxes on land and on improve ents and personal property of lessess.


