Record regarding to efforts to amend the constitution relative to amendments.

Nov. 12, 1923. Petition reported filed to add in section 7, of Art. ~~4~~ after the word "member" the word "voting," so as to require only three-fourths of those voting to amend.

No. 2 When submitted at annual election in Feb. 1924 the report of trustees as to result was as follows:

Article III, Section 6. The secretary shall conduct, by mail, on the first Tuesday in January of each year, a roll call of nonresident members, and any member who shall fail to respond for three (3) consecutive years shall be dropped from the membership of the corporation but may be reinstated, without payment of another membership fee, on approval by the Executive Council, of a new application for membership.

Annual Roll Call Amendment, petition filed June 1, 1925.

Add as section 6, of Art. 3, relating to membership, as follows:

The secretary shall each year make a revision of the list of non-resident members, writing on or before the 15th of January, by registered mail to the given address of each non-resident member, who has not been heard from officially since the beginning of the preceding year, requesting a verification of his addreses; and any members from whom no reply is received before Dec. 31st of such year shall be dropped from the list; provided that any member who has been so dropped shall be reinstated, upon his application therefor, reported by the Secretary to the Executive Council.

This was voted at annual election Feb. 4, 1926 and result reported by trustees as follows:

Necessary to carry - - - - -	99

Thrown out, - - - - -	7

This was a compromise amendment, agreed to by all interested in liberalizing the matter of amending. The petition requested that notices of proposed amendment be sent out by June 15 1925; that ballots be sent Sept. 15 with request for their return by Nov. 1, 1925 and that trustees notify secretary monthly thereafter of members whose ballots were received that those who had not voted might be urged to do so.

It appears that the 29 not enough interested to vote, with addition of 5 of the seven who spoiled their votes by some slip would have compassed the defeat of the amendment if every other member had voted affirmatively.

Resolved, that on account of present uncertainty of outlay and revenue, the Council, with great regret, finds it unable at present to assume the payment of incidental fees in the schools during the ensuing school year, but if possible later on will do so and regard to those who have paid such fees, etc., by accepting their receipts for the same on such.

Oct. 18, 1915

Coburg Council met in regular session with all members present, President Mrs. Cummings in Chair.

Minutes of meeting of Oct. 4 read, corrected to show setting aside for public park of land unleased between Fairhope and Murphy Avenues and Marsh Street and Dugaldie Ave.; also of unenclosed portion of leasehold of Shortyone Smith (deceased), possession of said unenclosed portion of said leasehold being resumed for such public use, under clause 9, of the lease, and permission to Fairhope Golf Club to use the land so set aside for Park, for the purpose of maintaining a golf course thereon and for the erection of a club house and to control play thereon under equitable rules, which will permit the use of same by the public, and without profit to the club for a period of two years, club house site and other improvements to be agreed upon by the club and the superintendent of lands and highways.

Golf Committee on sign at Pier Head reported closing a contract with Mr. Littlefield for furnishing and painting sign 6x20 ft. reading to w: "Fairhope Single Tax Colony Land for Homes, Farms and Factories, Free of Purchase Price, No speculation for anybody. Inheritate" for sum of \$20 to apply on account. The report of the Committee was approved.

Wm. Thompson reported for committee on same, agreement of committee to building of new stable, south of cattle and next to R.R. abutment and disposal of old stable and other buildings; and on matter of request of Southern Bldg. & Material Co. for permission to put a lumber shed on or adjoining wharf No. 2, that they had offered Company privilege of putting up a shed to be available for use of any vessel deserving and to become a part of Wharf property when paid for in wharf fees. Understood that Committee be continued in Volk of these matters.

Motion was carried that Wharf Company require to

payment of rent for the maintenance of boat and fish houses in connection with wharf No. 2, or that same to reward.

Moved and carried that Committee request that Peoples Railroad return lumber from the track

Notice from Rent Committee.

The committee appointed to fix the colony rent for the year 1916, have completed their labors, and will hold a meeting Tuesday night next Nov. 23rd to listen to objections and suggestions from lessers. The meeting will be held at the office of P. Y. Albright at 9³⁰ p.m.

The following changes have been made by the Committee:

Church Street reduced from 60 to 42 at the corner of Murphy Ave.

Section Street raised from 42 to 50 at the cor of Murphy Ave.; excepting the west side S side Section Street which was raised from 50 to 70 at the Post office and raised from 75 to 80 at the corner of Fairhope Ave.

Fairhope Ave. (Drug Store corner) raised from 175 to 200⁰.

"Rent Committee" Cont

Fairhope Ave. (Crawford Corner) raised from 150 to 175, the middle of the block 90 and the west end of the block Cor. of Church St. 80.

Crawford & Neely lots on Bayfront raised from 125 to 150.

Fels Ave. raised from 30 to 40 in the following blocks: Summit Street to Bayview Ave.

Bayfront property North of Swift land lowered from 60 to 50 for the first 3 blocks and from 50 to 40 for the next 2 blocks.

All of these figures are percentages. These are the only changes, and the rest of the rest lot remains the same as it was this year. No change has been made in the County rent list.

Following the meeting of lessees with the rent appraisement as per the above call, the committee revised its work and called another meeting of lessees to hear its final report, at Wheeler Hall, Dec 2, 1915 (same time date for hearing report provided by lessees on adjournment Nov. 4, 1915)

This meeting was organized by election of G. E. Littlefield chairman, and P. Y. Albright secretary.

The committee through Mr. Albright presented its report, recommending the following changes from 1915 rents.

Increase Section St. Between Fairhope Ave. & Murphy Ave 50 at the south end and 75 at north end, except west side of street to be 70 at the Post Office and 80 at north end of block.

Fairhope Ave. Between Section & Church streets, so. side of east end 2 block raised to 200; north side of east end 175; middle of block 90; west end of block 80.

Fels Ave., Between Summit St. and Bay View Ave raise to 40. Coke St.

Oak Street Between Summit & Bay raised to 20.
Crawford and Neely Lots raised to 150.

Fairhope Ave. in front of Livery Stable reduced from 60 to 50.
Church St. bet. Fairhope Ave & Murphy Ave. South end of block reduced to 40.

Murphy Ave., Bay View to Freedom 25; Freedom to Short 20.

Following allowances for physical depreciation
D.W. Davis lot $\frac{1}{3}$ off of \$2/3, Bayridge lot $\frac{1}{3}$ off of \$3/4.

With these exceptions rents to be as for 1915 rate per year to be .31 off figures given

Report of Committee discussed at length and following action taken:

Raises on Fairhope Ave. rejected

Appraisement approved with this exception.

The Budget prepared by Council was submitted (see page 11) and after discussion approved by unanimous vote.

A motion prevailed to request Colony to appropriate \$400 for cutting out stumps along roads, so that road machine can be used thereon.
