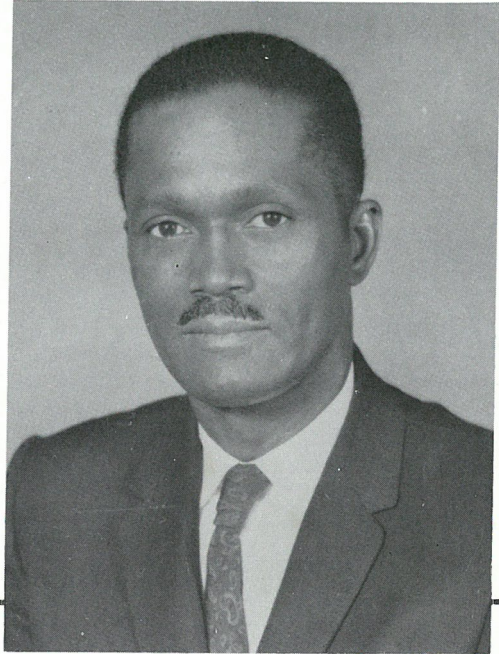


Historical Background

The Baldwin County Training School was founded as the Eastern Shore Missionary Baptist Academy in 1889 by the late Rev. S. B. Bracy. Its main purpose was to train young Baptist Ministers and Missionaries.

The 18 acre plot and two one-room buildings were deeded to the County and State for a public school in 1915. The name was then changed to the Eastern Shore Industrial School and in the late twenties the school became the Baldwin County Training School.

Five principals have served since the institution became a public school: Mr. Ligon A. Wilson, Mr. Robert T. Thurston, Mr. John Jackson, Mr. E. S. Peebles and Mr. Walker J. Carrol, who has served ably since 1938

Class History

It is indeed with a great deal of pride and pleasure that we place before our friends the yearbook of the Class of 1960. Bewildered, tense and energetic because of new surroundings, fifty-seven of us fresh from elementary schools and now determined to continue the chase of learning, entered the seventh grade class of Baldwin County Training School in the fall under the sponsorship of Mrs. S. B. Taylor and Mrs. R. S. Rhone. We chose the following for our class officers: President, Lorain Williams; Vice-President, Carolyn Yelding; Secretary, Mary Dale; Treasurer, Samuel Baker Jr.

Of the fifty-seven pupils who started out in the seventh grade, a spare number dropped by the wayside, but sixty-five enrolled in the eighth grade for the 1955-1956 session. Mrs. Pauline Jones and Mrs. Kay F. Williams were our sponsors. Our officers were Carolyn Yelding, President; Juanita Washington, Vice-President; Mary Dale, Secretary; and Lorain Williams, Treasurer.

Entrusted with the care and task of leading us during our ninth grade was Mr. J. W. Chancley. This particular year, our class presented the best skit for the Wonzanza.

Eighty-six enthusiastic souls entered the tenth grade in the 1957-1958 season. This number comprised additional classmates from Anna T. Jean, Loxley, and Foley Junior High. Although we were divided into two sections that year, we worked together as one group. Mrs. P. H. Jones and Mrs. P. D. Williams (both deceased) were our sponsors.

Seventy-four enrolled in the eleventh grade in the fall of 1958, and we chose Samuel Smith, President; Samuel Baker, Vice-President; Lois Williams, Secretary; and Willie Taylor, Treasurer; as our officers. The major activity was the Junior-Senior Prom at which the eleventh grade acted as host. Mr. Nathaniel Cunningham was our sponsor.

The 1959-1960 session arrived and seventy of us, young men and women, entered this institution with the hope of completing a successful twelve-year sojourn, and determined to make this the most illustrious year in our school life. The sponsorship is entrusted to Mrs. Thelma Carroll and Mr. John Leonard. Robert Johnson was chosen to steer the destiny of the class as President. Our other officers are Joe Patrick, Vice-President; Willie Taylor, Secretary; and Lenard Smith, Treasurer. The members of this senior class are represented in each school activity.

We, in human conceit, glorify in the history of this senior class, yet we will not deny our mistakes. We say in going---"To the members of the institution who have so carefully guided our destinies, we extend our sincere thanks. To the Juniors we bid a fond goodbye. To the other classes we wish much success. May this yearbook be cherished as a precious gem, preserved for all time in your treasure chest, in memory of the Class of 1960." With one accord, "We" the graduating class pledge ourselves to be ever loyal to our Alma Mater, to ever work for her advancement and to keep her standards just as high and even higher than they ever were before.
