

Editor's Message


We hope that our 1961 annual will serve as a treasure chest of eventful and resourceful moments spent at our dear Alma Mater.



The school's community includes Daphne and its adjoining communities of Belforest, Malbis, Spanish Fort, Montrose, Point Clear, Fairhope, Foley, Lillian, Summerdale, Battles Wharf, Steelwood, Loxley and Robertsdale. The school community has a radius of about 50 miles.

One of the purposes of the school is to train boys and girls in such a way as to cause them to develop into the most desirable citizens. From their varied school experiences, many pupils learn that their judgement must be suspected and the rights of others to opinions different from their own is to be respected.
