




### Guidance Counselor's Message





# Le Cercle Français




Le Cercle Français was organized in the fall of this school term. The purpose of the club is to provide opportunities for many enjoyable features of language study.


The Baldwin County Training School Masonry Club is composed of boys from the Masonry Class. They are also members of the State Trade and Industrial Club.




