




It was often necessary for Forest Service Lookouts to occupy their stations in early spring when in the lower valleys warm east winds caused fires to start in logged off lands.








Preparing seed beds at Wind River Nursery, Columbia National Forest, 1914.






First Public Camp Ground Register located in April 1916 on Eagle Creek Forest Camp Grounds Mount Hood National Forest.




