History -- The Siuslaw National Forest stretches intermittently along approximately 125 miles of the Pacific Coast and, in places, extends inland into the Oregon Coast Range. It is only one of two national forests with oceanfront property in the Continental United States, and it also includes some of the world's most productive forestland. The Siuslaw National Forest, initially part of two Forest Reserves, was officially established on June 30, 1908 by President Theodore Roosevelt.
