

IDAHO PANHANDLE NATIONAL FORESTS - RANGER ROLLCALL

(Kaniksu, Coeur d'Alene, and St. Joe NFs administratively consolidated as IPNF in 1973)
July 26, 2023

The initial source of the forests and ranger stations in this table is the "Ranger Stations of the Idaho Panhandle National Forests written by Cort Simms in 1986. Although this report focused on the hundreds of National Forest Stations (many never occupied as Ranger District Headquarters) it provided a great start to the hundreds of combinations of Ranger Districts for the currently combined three National Forests that make up the Panhandle National Forests.

Many Forest Reserves and National Forests made up the Idaho Panhandle National Forest's over the years adding to the complexity of completing this Ranger Roll Call document.

1898 – Priest River Forest Reserve established

1908 eliminated with lands going to form the Kaniksu and Pend Oreille

1906 – Coeur d'Alene Forest Reserve established and in 1908 adds the Palouse Forest Reserve

1907 – Palouse Forest Reserve established then in 1908 combined with Coeur d'Alene and name discontinued, and now is administered as part of the Clearwater National Forest.

1908 – Kaniksu National Forest established from part of the Priest River Forest

1908 – Pend Oreille National Forest established from portions of the Cabinet, Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai, Priest River. In 1933 combined with the Kaniksu National Forest, name discontinued.

1911 – St Joe National Forest established from part of the Clearwater & Coeur d'Alene

1973 – The Kaniksu, Coeur d'Alene and St Joe are the three remaining National Forests now existing as **the Idaho Panhandle National Forests**
