

Eldorado National Forest Ranger Roll Call and Forest Supervisors

The Eldorado National Forest was established by President Taft through proclamation on July 28, 1910, from portions of the Tahoe National Forest (809,211 acres) and Stanislaus National Forest (31,301 acres). As a result of further proclamations in 1928 and 1945, and an administrative order in 1949, additional lands were added to the Forest. In 1973, the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit was created from portions of the Eldorado, Tahoe, and Toiyabe National Forests. Initially, the Forest was comprised of six Districts, some of which were only staffed in the summer months. Rangers and Forest Guards were assigned to districts on an annual basis and, with some exceptions, changed from year to year. By 1914, all districts had a District Ranger assigned. District consolidations occurred over time and new Districts were created. Currently there are four districts – Amador, Georgetown, Pacific, and Placerville.
