

# Kane Boy, 17, Saved When He Sinks in Lake

## Forest Ranger Does Heroic Act in Water, Later With First Aid

KANE, Pa., Aug. 6.—George Gillotti, 17, of Kane, escaped death by drowning last night when he was rescued from 12 feet of water at Twin Lakes by R. A. Marker, United States forest service ranger.

The youth, who had become exhausted while attempting to swim from the shore to the diving platform in the middle of the lake, was given artificial respiration in the rescue boat before he revived.

Marker then took him to shore and gave him restoratives after wrapping him in blankets. Further attention was given the lad a few minutes later by Dr. H. J. McGhee

of Kane.

## Large List of Draftees

Total number of draftees from Local Board No. 1 of McKean county neared the 500-mark today when the second contingent in two days, comprising 12 men, left for an eastern induction center following the customary 14-day furlough at home after passing final physical examinations.

Reports from the board office at Mt. Jewett today disclosed that 489 men have left thus far as draftees, and, coincident with this announcement, it was reported that the August group would be 105 men.

## Plan for Final Test

Of the 105 total who will receive their notices next week, 98 are to be from the 1-A class and seven from the 1-B group. They will go to Erie for final physical examinations and then return home, those who pass to remain home for the regular 14-day furlough.
