Dear Brother

I received your last letter yesterday - and find that there was only two words misspelled in my last letter one of which you have marked wrong, it was ~~necessary~~ necessary you say should be necessary but I suppose your mistake arises from putting the wrong word first. Sept 23rd Arose at 6 I had my lessons all well to day. There has nothing of any consequence taken place. Sept 24th Arose at 6 My lessons to day were all well gotten. This evening I took a walk into the country and got some peaches. Sept 25th Arose at half past 6 To day I went a hunting, and killed two squirrels. The rest of the day I spent in writing. Sept 26 Arose at 7 This morning I attended the Episcopal Church, and heard Mr Nask preach an excellent sermon. In the afternoon Mr Binny (a half brother of Lawyer Binny) and myself went out to Mr Andrees and got some peaches, we remained there till about dark, and had quite a time in getting home, for we had a large piece of woods to come through, it was so dark that we could hardly see to keep the road. Sept 27th Arose at half past 6 My lessons

to day were all well gotten I have studied harder to day than I have for some time, and have not taken as much exercise as usual Sept 28th Arose at half past 6 I recited my lessons very well to day This evening after school I took quite a long walk and got some peaches at night I took my boots to the shoemakers and got them half soled I had to wait till he got them done for I had nothing to wear Sept 29th Arose at half past 6 I had all my lessons well except the Algebra which was in equations of the second degree I made a speech and read a composition This evening we had a dance at the college hall I went up to see them, but did not intend to stay very long, nor to dance. But the gentlemen insisted on my taking a part on account of there being more ladies than gentlemen The man who gave the dance was trying to get up a school and gave us to understand that it would be a free dance But when we got to dancing he told us that he would charge seventy five cents apiece for to pay the fiddler So I concluded to remain till the dance was over to get the worth of my money Sept 30th Arose at half past 6 I had my lessons well This evening I went and got some peaches, but they

are about all gone so I will have to look
for something else to induce me to take exer-
cise Oct 1st Arose at 6 My lessons were all
recited well This evening I attended the
debating society and made two or three
speeches Oct 2nd Arose at 7 I have been
confined to the house all day with a lame
leg I do not know what is the ^{matter} with
it but I think it is a sprain I have had
a severe headache all day I intended to have
sent this letter out in the mail to day
but could not get it written in time
Oct 3rd Arose at 7 I feel considerable better
to day than I did yesterday, but do not
feel able to attend church Mr Nash has
gone to Berkshire to preach to day
I am out of money again that bill I had
to pay at the dance the other night took all
I had If you have two dollars that you can
spare as well as not I wish you would send
them to me and I will pay you as soon as I can
get the money If you have not got the money
do not put yourself to any trouble to get it
for I can get enough of Rankin to last me
till I get home Please do not say any thing to
father about my writing for ~~money~~ money or
he will think that I spend more than there is
any use in Give my love to Aunt O Bannon
