

Old Resident Is Summoned

Ida Jane Post Fisher, pioneer of Monrovia and widow of the late James Fisher, passed away last evening at her home, 245 Grand Ave., which had been the family residence since August, 1903.

Mrs. Fisher's family came from England to Cambridge, Mass., in 1634 and settled on the land which is now the site of Harvard University. In 1636 they moved to Connecticut and in 1820 to Twinsburg, Ohio. Mrs. Fisher was born in Twinsburg, April 11, 1858.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Jane Fisher Jackson of Monrovia; a son, Frank L. Fisher of Cleveland, Ohio; two sisters, Mrs. Isabinda Haggett of Cleveland and Mrs. Nell Tucker of Twinsburg; a brother, Ernest W. Post of Minerva, Ohio; five grandchildren, Dorothy and Patsy Jackson of Monrovia; Frank L. Fisher jr., Mrs. Helen Rudolph, and Mrs. Katherine Breitweg, all of Cleveland; also two great grandchildren, Bobby and Jimmie Breitweg of Cleveland.
