

AEROPLANE BUILDER HAS SECURED SITE FOR PLANT

BUILDING ON E. LIME LEASED

Harvey F. Sutton, Inventor of New Flying Machine, Will Make This City Headquarters; Starts to Move Shop Tomorrow



WITH the leasing today of the Cronenwett building on East Lime avenue, just west of the old athletic club structure, by Harvey F. Sutton, inventor of the Sutton Tandem Monoplane, the aeroplane manufacturing plant for Monrovia is assured. Mr. Sutton, in company with a special committee from the Board of Trade, made a canvass of the business district today, and the result of the trip was that arrangements were concluded with Mr. A. F. Cronenwett for the leasing of his building. Alterations will be made to turn the structure into a modern hangar and manufacturing plant for flying machines, and Mr. Sutton will begin moving his \$2500 worth of special machinery and tools here from Griffith Park aviation field tomorrow.

As stated in Saturday's News, Mr. Sutton is an experienced aeroplane builder, and will not confine his work to the construction of his new monoplane alone, but will be prepared to construct any of the standard designs.

It is also his intention to establish here a practical school of aviation.
