



This is a Xeroxed copy of one of the earliest of the long series of annual publications of the Manitowish Waters Chamber of Commerce; it may even be the first. Internal evidence from a couple of the ads suggest that this was put out for the 1936 season.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Bey gave me the book; he was an advertiser in it, on behalf of his business located where his son still retains the house as a summer residence; at the time, Highway 51 was located on the opposite side of the building—the road in front of the cemetery is a part of old 51; Beys had to remodel the building to put the shop on the other side of the building.

Roy Jorgenson was an advertiser in the book, and active in forming the Chamber. His resort (ad on page 8) occupied all the space between the presentday Friar's Tuckaway, and after selling it, Jorgenson built his "Valhalla", the Tuckaway building.

To the best of my recollection (Michael Dunn's) this is what came of the resorts advertised; my time in Manitowish Waters dates back to 1937.

Schroeder's (p. 7) became Rudy's Rest Haven, later Ehrich's, later still Swanberg's Bavarian Inn.

Northwood Lodge (p. 8) has been much divided but its history included operation under the Ernest Meinels, the Andy Sindbergs, and later parts under names such as BoBoJiJoTo and Terces Ho. In the interim, it was also Bunn's.

Northern Lights Resort was built by a couple named Oestreich and consisted in a masonry hotel and frame cottages on the Rest Lake side of the highway at the dam. The small tavern building across the highway was a real estate office at its birth and then became the resort's tavern, and was later operated by the younger Henry Voss and by Ann Brunner and was turned into a restaurant and expanded by the Kontusches; now Pine Baron's.

The Chateau (page 10) was the bar and cottage complex now mostly closed, opposite the feather factory; it has had many owners and names.

Haakenson's (p 11), if memory serves, became Bazso's.

Deer Trail Cottages (p. 12) is a forgotten name and began as two or three cottages that later became the Little Star resort under the Crawfords. The former land holding is now occupied by the Rayalas from the lakeshore out to the garage on the highway; part was also operated as a little resort by Nehrings and later Schadts.

The Ilg resort closed without changing name; private summer homes succeeded the cottages; Joe Ilg, Jr., and wife Esther were well loved and still fondly remembered citizens.

The brothers Williamson were bachelor hosts and doubled as linemen. (Telephone) Their resort, I believe, later became Lor-Wood (Tellefson's) but I do know the rest of its progression. (P. 14).

The Win Mar (p. 15) was located on both sides of Hy. 51 (now W) near the dam. The cottages were located on Dam Lake below the highway, on the present Pea Parch side. A nice little multi-purposed building was located on the Rest Lake side of the road and had a little grocery store, bar and restaurant. It was destroyed by fire and apparently could not be rebuilt on the roadside site, after which the lady partners moved a building up to the other side of the road and reestablished the tavern business. Owners were two women named young and Zimmerman and the name of the business was derived from thier first names, Winnie and Marie--I don't know which was which. The father of one of them had been the caretaker at the dam after the logging era.

Mrs. Voelzke and her husvand Ed were very early residents: ee came in the

'Teens; he was a mechanic and Evinrude outboard dealer.

Mrs. Voelzke operated her little resort at their location (p. 16) but had sold it by the 1950s; I am not sure of the later ownership, but believe Aschnbrenners were owners at that location at one time later on.

Oakgrove Cottages were on Rest and after resale of the resort I lost any recollection of it; the cottages became private homes; I think Wendy Feiereisen later owned one of these. (P. 17).

Like Voss' (p. 6), Little Bohemia needs no explanation. (P. 18).

Koerner's (p. 19) also needs little explanation, for it was one of the most prominent of early resorts. Its complex spilled along both sides of Highway 51 at the Highway 51 bridge; the bar and restaurant were on the Manitowish Lake side and were victims of a fire. A hotel and cottages were on the Spider Lake side. The resort ran out of steam after the 1950s and various portions served different functions for several different owners, most notably in modern times as the Mazur family's Blue Bayou.

The Nicholses were the first operators of Red Feather Camp or Red Feather Lodge and the resort (p. 20) retained that name throughout its entire career as a resort, I believe. The Nicholses remained in the community even after retiring, in a new home they built along 30-30 road.

Locked Horn Lodge was an early closure. It was a property of the Startz family, and was on what we knew as the "Fire Lane" that ran back from the hardware store to connect—before the new Highway 51 was built bypassing downtown—with the Marathon Road. It was on the north side of "new" 51, inland on the widening of the river. The Brunner family later located homes around the resort site. (P. 21).

Belter's (p. 22) became Beaumont's resort on the island and was a favorite of young people in the 'Fifties. The island contained a tavern and cottages, and was operated in the 'Teens or 'Twenties by another Koerner family and by a family named Hunger, I believe from Wausau; my mother vacationed there around 1920.

The Tower (p. 23) was named for the firetower on the little rise behind it; Josephine Zermuehlen was its first owner—she had remarried by the time of her ad—and later the Bill Garbers operated the bar and restaurant, now the Fireplace. The upright log building on the property was a shortlived post office for the community around the 1920s. Virgin Forest Park was part of a welter of activities belonging to Robert Loveless, which included the roadside bar and cage that housed a black bear, cottages on Alder Lake, a campground, a lakeside pavilion and a sawmill. Among familiar names that the tavern had at its Highway 51 location, were Marty Cain's and Schauer's. It is located across the highway from Michael's.

Sunset Lodge was a small housekeeping cottage resort owned by Phyllis Andrews (p. 25) who lived most of the year at the Manitowish Post Office adjacent to the North Western Railway station. She was teacher at the first schools in Manitowish Waters and later succeeded her mother as postmistress at Manitowish. Her resort never changed hands, but rather she sold off the land and cottages piecemeal.

Way Back

IN 1884, over a half century ago . . . PETER VANCE, Guide, Land Cruiser and typical north woodsman, left Menominee, Wisconsin, and headed for the Manitowish Waters.

In those days it was a long journey, no eight cylinder cars to speed along the fine paved roads of today, no railroads with air conditioned coaches, no signs or road maps, just a wilderness in every meaning of the word.

Pete started out with two helpers and their means of transportation consisted of three canoes. They paddled up the Chippewa River to the mouth of the Flambeau, up the Flambeau River into the Manitowish River and then thru Sturgeon and Benson Lakes into Rest Lake where their journey came to an end. They had left Menominee in April of 1884 and arrived at their destination in August of that year. Many stops had been made enroute but the actual traveling time was one month, the distance travelled was approximately 200 miles. Their canoes were loaded with a year's provisions, guns, ammunition, surveying instruments and various tools. Pete had been engaged by the Chippewa Logging and Boom Company to survey the land and get ready for logging operations.

And so, in August of 1884, Pete Vance arrived in the famous Manitowish Waters region, the first white man to establish a residence in that locality. Little did Pete dream that this very region was destined to become one of the greatest vacation centers in the years to come. Let's have Pete tell us in his own way . . .

CENTRAL PROPERTY OF THE PARTY O

"Well sir, when I first came here I said to myself, here is a real country. There were no roads to the different lakes. You could, of course, hike through the tall timber or go by canoe. Those were, in my opinion, the good old days. Every man was his own judge and if a misunderstanding did arise, it was settled just as quick, and as a rule, they made friends after that. Deer were scarce in those days, that may seem strange when you consider the large number we have today. The reason they were few then was on account of wolves. Why it was nothing at all to see a pack of 25 or 50 at one time. We made short work out of them and in that way protected our fine deer. We killed as many as 100 wildcats in a single winter, many times with only a club.

"When people started to come here, I made a business of transporting them on the lakes to the place they wished to set camp. Later I started the first resort up here. My resort burned in 1903. A short time later another resort started and then came more. The first automobile came here from the next town in the year of 1908. Charley Harper chugged into town with the darn thing, he had then drove it over 10 miles, which was considered some trip. I shall never forget my first auto ride. Roy Buck got ahold of an old buckboard with an engine in it. We started out, hit a stump and the ride was over.

"We had to use oxen for work until the railroads came and then we got horses. Believe me, that was what we called a great improvement."


"Well, sir, times have changed, good roads anywhere you want to go, fine resorts on any lake you wish, a great many improvements from the old days but still as grand a place as you would want to find."

. . . .

"Old Pete Vance" as he is called today, still lives in his log cabin that he built 40 years ago on the shore of Dam Lake. He has, up until the time of writing, acted as a guide and when he isn't after the "big ones" he tackles his garden. When the hunting season comes, Pete is one of the first after a license.

Pete is a typical "old timer" and the community is mighty proud of him.



The Manitowish Waters Operates Its Own Fish Hatchery

Every year over 25 million Muskie, Pike and Bass are planted in the chain of lakes. In conjunction with the Hatchery is the Fish Lock, the first successful one of its kind in America. Each year thousands of mature fish, coming upstream from the Flambeau flowage, are conveyed over the Dam and into the Manitowish Waters.

Years ago, it was impossible to take the family along on a north woods fishing trip. Today you can have all the pleasures of fishing here, with all the comforts of home.

Owing to the fact that the entire chain of lakes is navigable from end to end, many good fishing spots can be reached from any resort. In fact, you can fish for weeks and never fish the same spot twice.

Every year produces its prize Muskie such as the one pictured above which is above the average. However, every day of the season does produce Muskies ranging from 7 to 25 pounds or more.

By no means is the Muskie the only member of the "finny tribe" to furnish the thrills. We must take into consideration the fighting Bass with catches of "small mouths" up to 7 pounds, and then too, the many fine strings of Wall-eye Pike, brought in by the guests.
