

To facilitate the arrangement of a basketball schedule it is suggested that the two game's with each team be played successively, either in the same week or in the same two weeks

he champion team of each league (basketball and hockey) will be determined by percentage of games won and lost, Immediately

Watersmeet, Michigan) will be notified of results in order that a record may be kept. In case of a. tie there will be a play-off.

The Champion team (basketball and hockey) of each league will. receive an appropriate cup or shield. The District Chamoion Team (hasketball and hockey) will also receive an appropriate dup or shield; in addition the team members of Bistrict Champions will receive an appropriate medal. The winners of the skating events will receive awards. The selection, cost, and manner of payment of these awards will be determined by the Award Committee. The District Recreation Officer appoints Lt. Golden of Camp Jumbo, and Lt. Cizon of Paint Lake as members of this committee.

Each camp may enter one contestant in each skating event.
