A parade emanated from Koerner's Spiller Lake resort, crossed the bridge breaking the ribbon, then continued to Vond resort and returned to the bridge where refreshments were served to all participating in the parade and all visitors crossing the bridge.

A bottle of champagne was broken on the bridge by Henry Vond indicating the formal opening.

The first car to officially cross the new bridge was driven by M. Filte of Sheboygan, which was followed by Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Korner, sr.

The first truck to officially cross the bridge was one of Boyen Truck to Rental, Milwaukee, and was driven by G. Giesler.

The newly opened bridge is of steel and concrete construction. The work being done by M. P. Gharrett of Shawano, Wis. The work on the bridge was started on September 15, 1948. The approaches to the bridge are at present are of gravel but will be black-topped within the next few days.

This bridge is a definite asset to Manitowish Waters and to the State of Wisconsin, inasmuch as this highway carries a very large amount of traffic as a check made recently showed.
