Ancestry of Mary Hagen and Joseph Pfeitter

THE GENEALOGICAL CHARTS

The Genealogical Charts show the ancestry of my children. Each chart has space for 31 persons—five generations. The generation number is indicated at the top of the page as a roman numeral.

On Chart Number 1 my children are listed in Generation Number I as Person Number 1. This is the only case in which more than one person has the same number.

My husband and I are listed in Gneration Number II. He See page 17 is Number 2 and I am Number 3 on the chart. Our parents are Generation Number III and are numbered 4 - 7. Our grandparents are Generation Number IV and are numbered 8 - 15. Our great grandparents (the great grandparents of our children) are Generation Number V and are numbered 16 - 31.

Each of us has a number used for identification. The chart number is written before the slant line and the number of the person on the chart is written following the slant line. For example my father is 1/6, that is, Chart Number 1. Person Number 6.

To the right of Gneration V is a number indicating on which chart the ancestry of that person in Gneration V is continued. The ancestry of the first person in Generation V is continued on Chart Number 2, the next person on Chart Number 3, etc. A number is allocated to the person even if the ancestry is not known.

Any chart may be continued by multiplying its number by 16 and subtract 14 from the answer. The number thus derived is the continuation number for individual #16 on the chart you are extending.

Example: Chart 3 times 16 equals 48, minus 14, equals 34. Thus 34 is the continuation number for #16 individual on Chart Number 3; 35 continued number 17 on chart 3; 36 continues as number 18 on chart number 3, etc.

Charts number 2 - 17 have Generations numbered V through IX. Each person on the page is given a number just as on Chart Number 1.

This sequence of numbering is continued indefinitely. Generations Numbered IX through XIII are found on charts numbered 18 - 257. Once again chart numbers are allocated even if the name of the person is not known.

Below the person's name the birth and death dates may be written.

You may wish to indicate descent from a marriage other than the first. In that case, the letter B, C, etc. would follow the number. A, indicating a first marriage, is omitted as being understood. For example: 3/15B would indicate the second marriage of person number 15 on chart number 3.

THE INDEX

The Index contains only the names of the persons in the direct ancestry.

The name of the wife is indexed by her maiden name and by the name of each of her husbands, if more than one. When a wife is listed under the name of her husband her maiden name is written in parenthesis. Jones, Mary (Smith).

Several different persons in the ancestry may have the same name. In this instance each different person is listed separately.

Following the name give the reference number—the chart number plus the person number (6/14).

The person listed in generation V will be number 1 on the continuation chart. Indicate both numbers.

A person may appear more than once in the ancestry. Follow his name with each of his numbers.

If you wish, include the generation number in the Index.

For many names there are several spellings. In these cases each of the spellings is given with a cross reference to the spelling under which the person is indexed.

THE FAMILY SHEETS

Each family in the ancestry is given a separate Family Sheet. These are listed alphabetically by the husband's name.

Following each family sheet is all other information concerning the family.

Pierre probably left France from the port of La Rochelle in the Province of Aunis in 1664. The Dutch ship NOIR, under the command of Captain Pierre Filly of Dieppe, had at least fifty men aboard. The 24 year old Pierre is mentioned on the crew manifest as coming from Chef-Boutonne, capital of the Canton of Deux-Sevres.

In the census of 1667 in New France, Pierre Blais is mentioned for the first time as living on the Ile d'Orleans and having been born about 1640, occupation laborer.

On June 22, 1667, before the Notary Paul Vachon, Pierre Blais received a concession of land within the limits of the future parish of Saint-Jean. In 1681 the census taker notes that Pierre owned 4 head of cattle and 15 arpents of cleared land. It was on this farm that he would live for the remainder of his life--33 more years.

Ann Perrot was a King's Daughter and brought a dowry into the family estimated #5 300 livres.

THE BLANCHET FAMILY

Source of Article Unknown

The Blanchet Family was founded in the XVII Century by the marriage in Quebec on Feb. 17, 1670 of Pierre Blanchet, native of Picardy, France to Marie Fournier, a native of Quebec, and a lineal descendant of the first Canadian colonist, Louis Hebert, apothecary, of Paris, who came to America with the immortal Champlain, the Father of New France.

"Among Hebert's numerous descendants are some of the most illustrous families of Canada; Joliet, DeLery, D'Eschambault, Fournier, Tachereau, Archbishop of Quebec, Archbishop of Oregon, Bishop A. M. A. Blanchet of Nisqually, Bishop Tache O. M. I. Bishop of Red River, Manitoba". (1)

Of this union there were born fifteen children, whose numerous descendants are now to be found among the prominent citizens of every section of Canada, particularly in the districts of Quebec and Montreal. Francis Blanchet, M. D., a cousin of the Archbishop was one of the most eminent professional men and patriots of his country. He was one of the founders of the first French Canadian Newspaper, the celebrated "Le Canadien".

Doctor Jean Blanchet, M. D., second cousin and fellow student of the Archbishop was a celebrated physician and statesman. When Leval University was founded at Quebec in 1854 Dr. Blanchet was chosen Dean of the Faculty and Professor of Medicine.

The Honorable Joseph Goderic Blanchet, M. D., third cousin of the Archbishop is further illustrating the family name by eminent services in the council of his nation. He served several times as speaker of the House of Assembly in Quebec, and House of Commons in the Dominion of Canada.

Archbishop Blanchet entered the Grande Seminary of Quebec on August 10, 1816. He was ordained to the Priesthood July 18, 1819 in the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Quebec by Bishop Bernard Claude, Coadjutor to Bishop Joseph Octavre Plessis, who was absent on a visit to Europe. He was assistant for one year at Notre Dame Cathedral.

Archbishop Blanchet can count eight priests on the paternal line of his family, one on his maternal line and six priests on his collateral line. His brother, Rt. Rev. A. M. A. Blanchet was Bishop of Walla Walla, Washington. His diocese was transferred to Nisqually, Washington, and then to Seattle, Washington. It is now an archdiocese.

The following is copied from "Our French-Canadian Ancestors" by Thomas J. Laforest, pages 30 to 34 published at Palm Harbor, Florida 1983

The twenty-five year old Pierre was a weaver by trade. He appears for the first time in New France in the census of 1667. He lived as a piad domestic in the home of Simon Lefebre, located on a hillside nearby Notre-Dame-des-Anges, to the east of Quebec. We don't know any details about the term of his indenture, or the reasons that motivated him to come to Quebec about 1665.

Simon Lefebre-Anger had a neighbor thirteen houses down the row, one Guillaume Fournier. Simon introduced his employee Pierre to the Fournier family, who soon came to appreciate his fine qualities. Pierre, in his turn, appreciated their eldest daughter, Marie. To prove the worth of this aspirant for his daughter's hand, Guillaume Fournier entrusted Pierre with the development of a piece of land he owned not far from Charlesbourg. The trial period was successful and the Seigneur of Saint-Joseph gave his fourteen-year old daughter in marriage.

The marriage contract was signed on Sunday 13 October 1669, in the home of the woodworker Jacques de la Roe, in the presence of the Notary Pierre Duquet, as well as relatives and friends of the Fournier family. Pierre did not have any old friends from Picardy with him, but three neighbors and their wives came in from the Riviere Saint-Charles to be his witnesses. Father Fournier gave his daughter a milk cow and to his newly acquired son-in-law he gave "a house that he owned near Saint Joseph." Pierre for his part took care of his bride's future with the assurance of 400 livres in case of his death and of 200 livres from his estate before any other partition.

The marriage took place in Notre-Dame de Quebec 17 February 1670, under the supervision of Father Henri de Bernieres. The newlyweds made their first home in the little cabin near Saint Charles which Pierre had furnished when still a bachelor.

The land his father-in-law had given him was not Very large, but neither did he own any draft animals. After three years of working with axe and mattock, Pierre decided to leave his little home, his shed, and his 4 arpents of cleared land. So on 13 October 1671, he went to Quebec and before Notary Romain Becquet he received a concession from Louis Couillard de Lespinay. The description: "26 arpents of fully wooded land, of which 3 arpents front on the Saint Lawrence River to a depth of 40 arpents." This grant was located in the seigneury de la Riviere-du-Sud, up to the Pointe-a-la-Caille, which today is St. Thomas de Montmagny. The grant goes on to state that "the charges to the concessionnaire shall consist of 3 silver livres and 3 live capons in rent to the seigneur and one sol in 'cens' for all of the concession.

On 8 October 1671, Pierre gave a three year lease on his property near Quebec to Etienne Potier. This farmer had to pay him "thirty bushels of good and salable wheat" delivered on the last day in October each year. However, the following autumn Blanchet sold this property to Louis Rouer for the sum of 200 livres, of which 100 was paid in cash.

On 21 November 1674, Pierre Blanchet guaranteed to underwrite a payment of 21 livres, 7 sols, 6 deniers, owed by his father-in-law to Pierre Normand the toolmaker. In order to avoid seizure of his boat in settlement of the debt, old Fournier agreed to make payments in kind, i.e., four chairs. He defaulted on this too, and on 29 April 1675 the Sovereign Council ordered Pierre to pay the debt plus costs.

Pierre continued to slave away on his farm at Pointe-a-la-Caille, even to expanding his domain by 4 more arpents in frontage. Toward the end of the summer of 1681 the census-taker visited the family, by now consisting of Pierre, his wife and 5 children. Their possessions were recorded as one gun, a half-timbered house, 7 head of cattle and 8 arpents of cultivatable land. Later on Pierre obtained yet another concession near the river, 5 by 40 arpents, at Saint-Pierre de Montmagny.

But let's take a look at another involuntary breech of the law. To saw a good plank one needs a good log and Pierre was providing Quebec with many good logs. While enjoying the fruit of his silviculture, quite inadvertently one fine day, Pierre wandered onto his neighbor's land and cut some trees. This neighbor was the Seigneur Louis Couillard who lost no time taking Pierre before the Sovereign Council. Pierre pleaded ignorance and stated his willingness to restore that which was not his. The Court ordered him to place in the hands

of his accusor "a third of the lumber in question."
All of this seemed to have been too much, for Pierre
for the next thing we know he was turned into the HotelDieu, the hospital of Quebec, with a heart attack.

Today, it is difficult to assess the anguish and suffering brought about by the infant mortality of those times. Pierre and Marie brought 16 children into the world, but only seven survived: Pierre, Pierre-Guillaume, Marie Madelaine, Jean, Francoise, Simon and Louis. During the one year of 1681, three of the children were taken to the cemetery at Cape Saint Ignace. Then Simon, a sickly unmarried man, disappeared in his thirties. It may be surmised that the Blanchet family did not enjoy good health.

Old Pierre Blanchet fell gravely ill on 10 April 1709. He sent for the Cure Mesnage, made his confession, received the last Sacraments and told his pastor his last wishes. Pierre, the old churchwarden, gave 6 arpents of land to the Church of Saint-Pierre. Then he gave an arpent of river frontage for the priestly instruction of his youngest son, Louise, age 8 years; however, his desires were not fulfilled.

The present Church of Saint-Pierre, built within a few miles of the setting of the first two, is still a magnificant cultural achievement.

Upon the death of Pierre, the missionary wrote in the Montmagny parish register, "This 12th day of the month of April in the year 1709 has been buried in the cemetery of the parish Saint Thomas of the Pointe-a-la-Caille by me the undersigned...the 'bonhomme' Blanchet, age about 72 years, after having received all the sacraments. A High Mass was sung for him." In the history book of the Blanchet family, they say he was 65 years old. Doubtless he had the appearance of an older man of 72.

The title "bonhomme" must be understood in the full sense of the word. Pierre Blanchet was an honest man, a hard worker who had more heart than learning—he knew not how to write—and a fervent Christian. It is in honor of Pierre Blanchet that the parish was placed under the protection of Saint Peter on 14 June 1713, because Our Ancestor had died at Saint-Pierre de Montmagny.

At his death Pierre left no less than 65 arpents of usable land, of which 9 arpents were at Saint-Thomas and 55 at Saint-Pierre. The personal property left by him was valued at 810 livres, 10 sols and 6 deniers. He had 2 big oxen in the stable, one black and the other red; 7 cows; 5 pigs; 4 geese; 7 chickens and a rooster. He had added a room of 40 square feet onto his old half-timbered house at Saint-Thomas, built of the stone of Saint-Pierre. Unfortunately, there was a lien against his estate of 500 livres, owed to Sieur Lotbiniere. This sum was the remainder of a loan Pierre took out on 6 October 1696, in the amount of 1213 livres and 10 sols.

As for his wife Marie Fournier, she put her affairs in order and placed herself under the guardianship of her son Jean. Used up by hard work and the bearing of sixteen children, the lights of her life were extinguished at the age of 60 years. She was buried in January of 1716 at Saint-Pierre.

One branch of the Blanchet family adopted the surname Laforest. No other variant has been recorded.

ARCHBISHOP F. N. BLANCHET

by Rev. Father J. B. Boulet, of Ferndale, Washington

Francois Norbert Blanchet, missionary and first Bishop and Archbishop of Oregon City, U. S. A., son of Pierre Blanchet, a Canadian farmer, was born Sept. 30, 1795, near St. Pierre, Riviere du Sud, Province of Quebec. After three years in the village school he went in 1810, with his brother. Augustine Magloire, later to become first Bishop of Walla Walla and Nisqually, to the Seminary of Quebec, where he was ordained priest July 18th, 1819. He was stationed at the Cathedral for a year and was then sent to Richibucto, New Brunswick, as paster of the Micmac Indians and Acadian settlers. In 1827 he was recalled to Montreal, and appointed pastor of Soulanges. During the cholera of 1832 he attended the stricken so fearlessly that the Protestants of the place presented him with a testimonial. In 1837 he was appointed Vicar General by Bishop Signay for the Oregon Mission, and he set out on May 3rd, 1838, accompanied by the Rev. Modeste Demers with the annual express of the Hudson Bay Company. They arrived at Fort Vancouver on Nov. 24th.

For four years they labored alone. They were then reinforced, from time to time, by other priests, both secular and regular, and by Sisters of Notre Dame of Namur, Belgium. On Dec. 1st, 1843, the Oregon Mission became a Vicariate Apostolic and Father Blanchet was named its first Vicar. He was consecrated Bishop in Montreal on July 25th, 1845. He visited Europe at different times in quest of priests and financial help. On July 24th, 1846, the Vicariate was erected into a Provice, and Bishop Blanchet was made Archbishop of Oregon City, his brother Magloire became Bishop of Walla Walla, and Father Demers Bishop of Vancouver Island.

The Archbishop was indefatigable. He held his first Provincial Council in 1848, attended the First Plenary Council of Baltimore in 1852, went in 1855 to South America and collected for two years in Chile, Peru and Bolivia; he went to Canada in 1859 and returned with 31 priests and sisters. He attended the Second Plenary Council of Baltimore in 1866; on July 19th, 1869, he celebrated his golden jubilee of ordination, and in the following October set out for Rome to assist at the Vatican Council in 1870. When Bishop Seghers was made his Coadjutor in 1879, he retired to the hospital of the Sisters of Providence at Portland. He is the author of the "Historical Sketches of the Catholic Church in Oregon". In 1880 he resigned and died in Portland June 18th, 1883. He found on the Pacific Coast a wilderness, both spiritual and material; he left, after 46 years of heroic work, a well-organized ecclesiastical pro-He will be known in American history as the Apostle of Oregon.

An interesting view of the state of the diocese in 1852 is to be had from the pen of Saint-Amant, an envoy of the French Government who visited Oregon in that year. Saint-Amant spent some days with Archbishop Blanchet at Oregon City and reports that "the archepiscopal palace was worthy of John the Baptist." Speaking of conditions at St. Paul he writes: "The priest is everything to the families on French Prairie -- friend, confident, law-giver, counselor, arbiter, judge. The financial condition is very unsatisfactory. The churches are mortgaged to heretics and unless the Catholics make a strenuous effort to save them. they will change altars and lose the Real Presence". In the former residence of the Archbishop at St. Paul, Saint-Amant was astonished to find five hundred volumes containing the writings of the Fathers of the Church (Migne's Patrology. now at the Archbishop's residence, Portland) in Latin and Greek. He observed that these were scarcely the equipment to be expected in the home of a missionary among the savages. The fact that Father Blanchet had carried this extensive and precious library of Patristic lore across the mountains and plains is an illustration of his great love of learning which persisted during the most trying years of his missionary life.

NOTE--Snowden tells the following interesting story: "Early in November Father Blanchet received notice that Oregon had been made a vicariate apostolic, of which he was to be the ecclesiastical head, with the title of Bishop of Philadelphia. Upon reflection, and consideration of the difficulties of the journey, and the time he would need to be absent, he concluded to go to Mexico (to be consecrated). But on arriving there, he found that while the notice of his appointment was regular and its genuineness undoubted, the canonical law required his own identification as the person for whom the appointment had been made. As identification was impossible where nobody could be found who had ever seen him before, he went to France but found the same difficulty there. He accordingly crossed the Atlantic again to Canada, where, at Montreal, the city from which he had been sent out to the West seven years earlier as a missionary priest, the pioneer head of the Catholic Church in Oregon was duly consecrated." (History of Washington, vol. II, p. 166.

BISHOP A. M. A. BLANCHET

b. Rev. Father J. B. Boulet

Augustin Magloire Alexandre Blanchet, brother of F. N. Blanchet, first Bishop of Walla Walla and Nisqually, State of Washington, was born August 22nd, 1797 on his father's farm near the village of St. Pierre, Riviere du Sud, Canada. After attending the village school for three years, he was sent to Quebec, with his brother Francois Norbert to study for the priesthood. He was ordained June 3rd, 1821. After a year as assistant pastor at St. Gervais, he was sent as missionary to the Isles de la Madeleine and later to Cape Breton Island. He gave four years of ministry to the Gulf Provinces. Then he was recalled to the Vicariate Apostolic of Montreal, and was successively pastor of four parishes, in one of which he was the successor of his elder brother. In 1846, while a Canon of the Montreal Cathedral, he was appointed Bishop of the new diocese of Walla Walla in what is now the State of Washington. He was consecrated Sept. 27, 1846. In the following spring he set out overland for his distant see with one priest, Rev. J. B. A. Brouillet, and two students. At Pittsburgh he declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States. At St. Louis the party was increased by Father Ricard, two deacons and Brother Blanchard, all members of the Order of Mary Immaculate. Fort Walla Walla was reached on Sept. 5th 1847. The Bishop located at The Dalles, and then multiplied his apostolic labors through the vast missions; built churches; founded academies and colleges; he started schools for the Indians; he begged for priests in Canada and abroad. and he obtained sisters for hospitals and other institutions.

In 1850 the See of Walla Walla was suppressed and that of Nisqually erected in its stead, with headquarters at Fort Vancouver. In 1852 he attended the First Plenary Council of Baltimore, but, on account of infirmities, he was unable to attend that of the Vatican. In 1879, after 32 years of arduous labor in Washington, he resigned his See and was named Titular Bishop of Ibora. He spent his last 8 years in prayer and suffering. His peaceful death, which occurred Feb. 25th, 1887, was a fitting close for his life of sacrifice. He is revered as the Apostle of Washington.

Sister Letitia Mary Lyons, M. A. wrote a very complete dissertation on the experiences of Francis Norbert Blanchet. It was published in 1940 by the Catholic University of America Press. There is a copy at the Seattle Public Library. The following is copied from that book.

Pages 2 to 4

Blanchet was born in 1795 at St. Pierre, Riviere du Sud, Lower Canada, and was baptized September 4, of that year at the neighboring village of St. Francois. He and his younger brother, Augustine Magloire, who was later to share his work in the northwest, were sent to the parish school in the village of St. Pierre, where in 1808 Francis received his First Communion and where he was confirmed the following year. In 1810 he and his brother enrolled at the minor seminary of Quebec and in 1816 Francis went to the superior seminary. Here after a distinguished theological course, he was ordained to the priesthood, July 19, 1819, and celebrated his first Mass the next day. The ordination ceremony was performed by Bishop Bernard Panet, coadjutor to Joseph Plessis, the bishop of Quebec, during the absence of the latter in Europe.

After his ordination Father Blanchet was stationed for several months at the Cathedral of Quebec. But in 1820 he began his missionary career when, in answer to an appeal for a French-speaking priest, he went to New Brunswick to care for the Acadians of that region. The vast territory under his charge was a wilderness, in which the young priest experienced some of the difficulties that he was later to find on the other side of a vast continent. Edmund Mallet gives this description of missionary life:

The Abbe Blanchet's mission which was visited regularly at least twice a year, involved the travel of about 225 miles to reach the several stations, situated on rivers, bays and capes. In summer this was done in birch canoes along the rivers; in log canoes called pirogues, when crossing the arms of the sea; on horseback across the country, and in winter, on skates or snow-shoes or in dog trains, and this in a region where the thermometer marks thirty degrees below zero and where for some months the earth and ice are covered with several feet of snow. The oldest inhabitants still tell of his heroism in storms and dangers of every kind; how he encouraged his good Acadian or Indian guides, and shared with them their arduous labors and perils. His zeal never flagged, and after one of these long journeys to his distant stations, or after attending a sick call at a distance of a hundred or two hundred miles, he would return to his humble dwelling in the village as cheerful and joyous as did the Acadian farmer from his day's labor in his fields. Thus was

the missionary being schooled for the duties of his apostolate in the wilds of distant Oregon.

But, although conditions of living were hard, the priest had many a consolation among the Acadians who reverenced their missionary and acknowledged him their father, teacher and advocate.

The Indians, too, responded to his teaching and gave evidence of his devoted service to their interests. Each year in July there took place the pilgrimage in honor of St. Anne, one phase of missionary life which particularly appealed to Father Blanchet. The Indians of the whole surrounding country assembled on the northern shore of the Hiramichi Bay to celebrate the feast of the saint on July 26. After weeks of preparation, the neighboring tribes gathered at the Bay. The Micmacs, dressed in their best, formed a flotilla in their brightly decorated pirogues and amid the firing of guns, started on their journey to the north with their missionary at their head. The coming of the group from Richibucto occasioned friendly demonstrations among the tribesmen. Then followed a week of religious exercises and instructions conducted by Rev. Thomas Cook, afterwards bishop of Three Rivers, Canada, which ended with the general reception of Holy Communion on the fest of St. Anne.

In the spring of 1827, Father Blanchet accompanied an old friend, Joseph Lavignon, to Quebec. He expected to be absent only a short time from his mission but his appointment to the parish of The Cedars, or St. Joseph de Soulanges, in the district of Montreal, temporarily put an end to his missionary work. The little village of The Cedars was a rendezvous for boats passing up and down the river, a meeting place for travelers and voyageurs. Here the missionary met for the first time the fur trader and the adventurer who had braved the dangers of the journey to the west and had come back with tales of the fortune to be won from dealings with the Indians. There is no evidence that the priest was especially interested in these frontiersmen; no indication that he might have been ambitious to resume a missionary career.

Blanchet had hoped to be consecrated in Quebec by the prelate who had sent him to Oregon but Archbishop Signay was away making the visitation of his diocese and Blanchet. finding it would be impossible to have the ceremony there, returned to Montreal. On July 11 "Le Canadien" (newspaper) announced that bishop-elect Blanchet would be consecrated July 25, along with Charles Prince, bishop-elect coadjutor of Montreal. Accourdingly on Saturday, July 25 there took place in St. James Cathedral one of the most impressive ceremonies that had ever been witnessed in the city. The Church was filled with an immense crowd which was thrilled by the inspiring spectacle of the consecration of two bishops. There were present besides the two bishops-elect, five others, the Bishops of Montreal (Ignatius Bourget), of Kingston (Remi Gaulin), of Sidyme (Pierre Turgeon, coadjutor to Bishop Signay), of Toronto (Michael Power), and of Carrah (Patrick Phelan, coadjutor to Kingston), not less than 143 priests and 57 ecclesiastics. The Most Reverend Ignatius Bourget, Bishop of Montreal, was the consecrator. Blanchet was assisted by Bishop Gaulin of Kingston and his coadjutor. Bishop Phelan; Prince by Bishops Turgeon and Power. The three vicars general assisted at the throne of the officiator: F. Demers, as assistant priest, Thomas Cooke and Archambault, as deacons of honor; Francis Porlier was deacon and Remi Robert, sub-deacon. Edward Crevier, cure of St. Hyacinthe, preached the sermon, in which he commended the worthiness of those receiving the honor and outlining the duties and burdens of the office of the episcopacy, calling attention to the obligation of the clergy to share that burden.

The gathering of ecclesiastics, seven bishops, several vicars general, numerous clergy, the great crowd of faithful. silent and recollected, the beautiful church decorated for the occasion, the ecclesiastical vessels of great richness, the tones of the organ, the beauty and gravity of the Gregorian, the majesty of the ceremonies, all combined to make this occasion, one unforgettable in the annals of Montreal church history.

MARIE PALMIRE BLANCHET

SISTER JEAN OF JESUS

Sister Jean of Jesus was the daughter of Theodore Blanchet and Domine Chamberland and the grand neice of Bishop and Archbishop Blanchet. She was born at Cacouna, Quebec, Nov. 6, 1850 and died at Walla Walla, Washington, Oct. 7, 1931.

Sister was a pharmacist by profession.

She arrived at Vancouver, Washington May 19, 1874. Her first assignment was at Portland, Oregon, then Walla Walla, Washington. She spent 7 months at a hospital in Seattle, probably Providence.

On April 28, 1875 she made her vows as a member of the Sisters of Providence.

Until Feb. 8, 1894 she served at the Hospital of Saint Marie in Walla Walla as Superior.

She then became head of the Province for the Sisters of Providence.

In 1900 she was Superior at Walla Walla for a brief time and then in the same year she served as Superior at Vancouver.

From 1909 to 1912 she was Assistant Provincial.

She was at a hospital in Yakima from 1914-18.

The remainder of her life was spent at Walla Walla.

Father Francis N. Blanchet and Father Modeste Demers enjoyed a warm reception from the post complements and local indians at Colville, Okanogan, Nez Perces, and Vancouver. Unlike the Protestants, these priests had in the French-Canadian "voyageurs" latent congregations awaiting them at every company station. As most of these people had been long out of contact with their church, the priests were busy from the moment they arrived baptizing, solemnizing marriages, hearing confessions, celebrating Mass and teaching prayers and catechisms. This is not to suggest a purely blissful reunion of priest and people; Blanchet was initially shocked by the annual assault of the spring interior brigade upon the staid routines of Fort Vancouver "a hideous assemblage of persons of both sexes, devoid of principles and morals", and he was distressed by the casual indifference of both Indians and company personnel to the virtues of monogamy. Still, from the beginning of their work, the Catholics did have the advantage of a core of adherants at each post.

For several years these two Canadian priests conducted an itinerant mission, traveling from post to post, making special journeys into various tribal areas, and covering a tremendous extent of country.

River settlement, operating under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Quebec.

In December, 1843, all the Catholic Missions were united under Blanchet, now designated Bishop of Drasa. In 1844 the Jesuits initiated regular services at Fort Colville and began further work in the Kalispell region. (These Jesuits were from St. Louis). The following year Blanchet went to Europe to recruit priests and nuns for an enlarged program. While he was there, the Vatican responded to his first hand account of the potential of his realm by creating an ecclesiastical province of Oregon, with Blanchet as Archbishop and Metropolitan. Eight dioceses were delimited with, although only Oregon City, Vancouver Island, and Walla Walla were established immediately. In October, 1847, the Bishop of Walla Walla (A. M. Blanchet, the Archbishop's brother) settled in the crude house of a Cayuse chief on the Umatilla, another priest was sent to the Yakimas, and the Roman Catholic program for the tribes of the Columbia Plain got under way.

Florin, Lambert, "Tales the Western Tombstones Tell"

From the article, "Frontier Sister of Mercy", Page 17 and 18-the story of Sister Joseph. (Not a Blanchet)

In 1853 Abbe Augustine Magloire Alexander Blanchet came to Montreal to seek volunteers among the sisters to go to Fort Vancouver. Sister Joseph volunteered but was refused as being too valuable where she was. Abbe Blanchet selected five nums and sent them off by themselves while he went about other business in Montreal. The girls eventually arrived at Oregon City instead of Vancouver and, because of confusion and lack of communication, they were sent to San Francisco and ultimately wound up in Chili.

In 1856 Abbe Blanchet tried again and this new group of five nuns did include Sister Joseph. This time the party was escorted by the Abbe himself, the ship "Illinois" arriving at Jamaica Nov. 13, where the sisters were presented with a branch bearing pranges from the Jesuit garden. One of the girls wrote in her journal, "The presentation of this branch made us think of the fall of Mother Eve". At Colon they took a narrow gauge railroad across the Isthmus. Passage had been arranged at Panama City to board the "Golden Age" for San Francisco and as they were rewed out to the ship they were surrounded by naked boys diving for coins. The girl's journal reports, "we were horrified and did not know what to do with our eyes. But we couldn't help being amused when we saw the Abbe Blanchet whacking them with his furled umbrella and shouting "Allez-vous-en, petits salops!"

The "Brother Jonathan" took the party out of San Francisco and for the first time the girls enjoyed a mirror-like ocean. This was short-lived for the next day a storm tossed the vessel and all were sick. "I exhausted all my prayers", wrote the journal keeper, "and then started all over again". When the mast fell on deck in a welter of rigging, a young priest in the party, Father Rossi, banged on the Bishop's door, crying, "My Lord, don't you know we are perishing!" A loud noise and sudden stoppage of the engines interrupted him and then he shouted again, "The captain has told us we are about to cross the terrible Columbia River Bar, that grave of so many ships". But the few remaining sails took the ship to a safe entry, the sisters gathering on deck to sing the ancient hymn "Stabat Mater".

VIII. G. 1. Blanchet, Rt. R.v. Mgr. Francois-Xavier from Memoires de la Societe Genealogique.

Nephew of Bishops Augustin Norbert and A. Magloire A. Blanchet, son of their brother Hubert and of his wife Julie Prevost, he was born at St. Charles, County of Bellechasse, in the Province of Quebec, on July 22, 1835. He received his first rudiment of education at his native village school before being sent to the Quebec Seminary where he completed his classical studies and course. Having opted for the priesthood, in 1839 he entered the Grand Seminary of Montreal (Sulpician priests) for his theological studies. On April 12, 1863, he was ordained to the priesthood by His Grace Bishop Ignace Bourget in the Cathedral of Montreal. Having volunteered, like his Uncles to devote his life to the Oregon missions, he left Canada a few days later for those distant lands. At his arrival there, he was appointed in charge of the Jacksonville mission where he remained for 25 years, or till 1888. organized the Parish, completed the construction of the church at that place and built a church at Eagle Point, of which he also took charge. It was also due to his efforts that the Nuns of the Community of Holy Names of Jesus and Mary came and opened a convent at Jacksonville. He also built a permanent residence for the Clergy there. In 1888 he was transferred to St. Paul, in Marion County where he remained till 1895. In 1890 he had been appointed as Vicar-general of the Oregon Diocese. At. St. Paul he completed the construction of a brick church, also a residence for the Pastor or priest in charge. In 1895 he was again transferred to Gervais where he completely renovated and enlarged the church, installed a new Way of the Cross, statues and other church ornaments, also new flooring and pews. His reputation as a church builder and organizer was most appreciated by his Bishop as well as by all the people. In 1898 his prolonged and incessant activities impaired his health and compelled him to a complete rest, so for a few months he retired at the St. Vincent Hospital, helping as chaplain, before leaving for a trip of convalescence to Europe, trip offered him by his former parishionners and friends. He visited Brussells, Paris and other Cities on his way to Rome. On March 17, 1900, His Holiness Pope Leo XIII appointed him "Protonotary Apostolic to the Holy Seat". The investiture of the insigna of that honour upon the Recipient gave cause to a solemn and imposing ceremony presided by Bishop Christie representing His Holiness, in St. Mary's Cathedral, in presence of several members of the Clergy and of an immense gathering of people. Clear of mind but unable to continue his activities on account of ill-health and infirmities. he. soon after that retired to the St. Vincent Hospital where he spent his few remaining years in prayer and meditation and at the writing of his Memoirs and a History of the Oregon Missions. He peacefully passed away at portland, Oregon, on May 22, 1906.

Antoine Blanchon is not the same person as Etienne Blanchon. Some books indicate they are the same person. The parents of Antoine are unknown.

Pioneer of 1851 Succumbs at Home in Eugene

FAMOUS MEN HIS FRIENDS

Oregon Man Campaigned State With General Joseph Lane--Interment to Be at Woodburn Beside Body of Mrs. Casey

EUGENE, Or., March 19.—(Special.)
—James Casey, Oregon pioneer, who
played a prominent part in early affairs in the state, died at his home in
Eugene this morning of old age. He
was born in County Loth, Ireland, in
1827.

James Casey came to America in 1849. Two years later he crossed the plans to Oregon with an ox train organized by Aaron Rose, for whom the town of Roseburg, Or., was named. Mr. Casey was the official blacksmith for the Rose party. After his arrival in the state he opened a blacksmith shoat oregon City.

The Rose party endured many hardships in making the trip to Oregon and were saved from starving by Dr. John McLoughlin, "father of Oregon," who came to their rescue by sending a pack train loaded with flour worth \$40 a barrel and other provisions for free distribution among the immigrants.

Mr. Casey took an active part in early political affairs in Oregon. He was an uncompromising Democrat and campaigned the state with General Joseph Lane. During the later years of his life he was an admirer and warm personal friend of United States Senator George E. Chamberlain.

Mr. Casey had a good memory and delighted in telling stories of old times. He took part in the Salmon River gold rush. He was at one time offered the block where the Hotel Portland, in Portland, now stands for \$50. He did the blacksmith work for the Oregon Rogue River War soldiers, making horseshoe nails from scrapiron, and never received any compensation for his services.

He married Ellen Fagin at Oregon City in 1853. The following winter the young people moved to a farm near Woodburn, where they made their home for 64 years. Mrs. Casey died in 1909 and Mr. Casey has since made his home with a daughter in Eugene.

They were the parents of 13 children, eight of whom survive. There
are also 10 (?) grandchildren and six
great grandchildren living. The children of

WOODBURN. Or. May 27 (1903) -- Two of the most highlyesteemed residents of this vicinity, Mr. and Mrs. James Casey, celebrated the golden anniversary of their marriage at their home on May 19. Both are natives of Ireland. Mr. Casey crossed the plains in 1851, and his wife, then Miss Ellen Fagin, in 1852. Both at first located in Oregon City, where they were married by Bishop Blanchard (sic) on May 19, 1853. Mr. Casey carried on the business of blacksmithing in Oregon City until 1854, when he purchased and moved into a fine 300-acre farm near Woodburn. where they have lived for the past 49 years. Of 13 children eight are living. They have 18 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. Mr. Casey and wife are both in good health and bid fair to live many more years yet. Seven of their children assembled at the old home and assisted in the celebration. It was the first time so many of them had been together for 20 years. They were: John Casey of Portland; Bartholomew Casey of Dallas; Sister Placida of the Catholic Indian mission school in British Columbia: Mrs. Annie Prevost, of Sacramento, Cal.; Mrs. E. L. Campbell of Woodburn; Mrs. J. B. Coe of Portland. and Miss Madge Casey, at the old homestead. The absent child was Thomas Casey of Great Falls, Mont. The bride and groom were the recipients of costly presents and congratulations from friends and admirers living in many parts of Oregon, as the hospitable couple are well known in the pioneer circles of the state. Mr. Casey is 77 years of age and his wife 74 years.

XIII. Cloutier, Zacharie

The following is copied from the Dictionary of Canadian Biograph, p. 232

Cloutier, Zacharie, master carpenter, pioneer at Beauport, originally from Saint-Jean-Baptiste de Mortagne in Perche; b. c. 1590; d. 17 Sept. 1677 at Chateau-Richer.

Having married Xainte Dupont on 18 July 1616, Cloutier entered into an undertaking at Mortagne with Robert Giffard, the seigneur of Beauport, on 14 March 1634; by the terms of this agreement he was to come to Canada that same year with his fellow-countryman Jean Guyon du Buisson, senior, and he received at the same time the grant of an arriere-fief at Beauport. The two settlers took formal possession of their lands on 3 Feb. 1637. The previous year, if not before, their families had joined them in Canada, for the two households figure in the marriage contract of Robert Drouin and Anne Cloutier on 27 July 1636.

Cloutier's holding, the fief of La Clouterie (or La Cloutiererie) brought him into conflict with his neighbour Guyon and with Giffard, his seigneur. He sold it to Nicolas Dupont de Neuville on 20 Dec. 1670 in order to go and settle at Chateau-Richer, where he had already received a grant of land from Governor Jean de Lauson on 15 July 1652. Zacharie Cloutier brought up five children; he appears to be the ancestor of all the Cloutiers in Canada. He signed himself with a mark shaped like an axe.

XIII. E. Robert Drouin

Drouin, Robert, pioneer on the Beaupre shore; b. 6 Aug. 1607 at Saint-Barthelemi du Pin-la-Garenne, Perche, son of Robert Drouin and Marie Dubois; buried 1 June 1685 at Chateau-Richer.

The date of Drouin's arrival in Canada is not known, but it is certain that he was here by 1636. In 1641 he already had a farm near the Riviere aux Chiens on the Beaupre shore, although he did not receive the concession for it until 17 April 1646. By his marriage with Anne Cloutier, which was celebrated 12 July 1637, he had three daughters; by his second marriage, with Marie Chapelier on 29 Nov. 1649, he had eight more children.

It is almost impossible to trace any French-Canadian genealogy without encountering Robert Drouin among the earliest ancestors. That would seem to us to be his greatest claim to fame. It is also to be noted that his marriage contract with Anne Cloutier (which preceded by nearly a year the religious ceremony), concluded 27 July 1636 in Robert Giffard's house and drawn up in the absence of a notary by Jean Guyon du Buisson, is the oldest marriage contract preserved in the original in Canada.

XIII. Cloutier, Zacharie

Zacharie Cloutier, possibly with his family, sailed from Dieppe the end of May 1634 and arrived in Canada August 8, 1634. The ship was captained by Captain de Ville.

He first settled at Three Rivers. In 1644 they settled at Beauport at the Manor of Robert Giffard and later moved to Chateau-Richer where he spent the rest of his life.

Doubille and Casanove: "Daily Life in Early Canada"

Gifford returned to Mortagne. The first to join him were artisans of essential trades, the master mason Jean Guyon and the master carpenter Zacharie Cloutier who, besides their wives had five and six young children respectively.

They left Mortagne itself at the beginning of April 1634. The families crammed themselves into heavy wagons laden with provisions, furniture, implements, tools and family souvenirs, and by way of Rouen reached Dieppe where they were to embark. After a long though uneventful crossing the ship set down its little cargo of resolute men, brave women and wondering children off the rock of Quebec. In all forty-three people, including six complete families, deliberately surrendered themselves to their destiny, which (though they did not know it) was to found a country unbelieveably more vast than the one they had left behind.

Brebner, J. B. "Canada"

A party of real colonists came out in 1634, a herd of cattle was established, and the first settlement was founded at Three Rivers.

Pierre was one of the members of the Company of the One Hundred Associates organized in France to promote the colonization of Canada.

Pierre and Françoise came to the New World on the sailboat "Le Sallemande" and arrived at Tadoussac, 125 miles east of Quebec, on August 30, 1620.

Francoise was the sister of Marguerite Langloise who married Abraham Martin. They arrived together. He received a concession of ground that formed the plateau where Wolfe and Montcalm fought the battle of Quebec. This battleground is known today as "The Plains of Abraham", named for him.

Helene, the wife of Samuel de Champlain, was the Godmother of Helene Des Portes.

The baby, Helene, was the first child born in the New World of European parentage to grow to be an adult.

John Fagan stated that he was a resident of Oregon on the 1st day of September 1852. John and Ellen Fagan were mentioned as godparents on January 30, 1853.

John Beard became a Catholic shortly before his death. He was buried from the Catholic church and buried in the cemetery adjoining Tangent. According to Polk in 1888 he was a grocer and Justice.

Mary Beard was buried from the Catholic Church at Albany, a priest from Eugene officiating as the Albany priest was out of town. Her estate was valued at \$3700. It was Probate Number 1872 Linn County, Oregon. Petitioner was J. F. Beard.

Initially, the brothers Mathurin, Jean and Pierre lived on a farm, in a little village called La Gagnoniere in the forest of Perche, between Tourouvre and Ventrouze. Their parents, Pierre Gagnon and Renee Roger, were tenants of his father and mother Barnabe and Francoise Crest, who had bought the farm from Gervais Roger and Marion Aubert on 28 December 1565. One should also note that they owned an inn on the same spot.

In 1635 one finds the three brothers, Mathurin, Jean and Pierre at Quebec where they opened a shop, 60 by 24 feet, on the Rue Saint-Pierre in the lower town. Their business partner was Mace Gravel who married Marguerite, daughter of the sister of these three first ancestors, on the 1st of May 1644 at Quebec. Later they sold this business to Pierre Pellerin on 9 October 1668.

Afterwards they went to Chateau-Richer to settle down. There is some question, according to Raymond Gariepy, that they might have owned a place at Saint Charles of Cape Tourmente from 1640 to 1646.

Mathurine

He was born on 22 October 1606 at La Gagnonniere, two miles from Tourouvre where he was baptized. He lived there with his parents until he was 29 years old. He left for Canada in 1635 with his brothers. He opened a shop at Quebec; being the best educated, since he was the only one who could write, he kept the accounts. We note that he made a buying trip back to France in 1643 for their business. Toward 1640 he settled at Chateau-Richer on a grant of land 6.5 arpents in river frontage by 126 in depth; a survey in 1663 shows him located between the land of Michel Roullois and that of Pierre Gagnon, his brother. From 1646 to 1674, he bought and sold many pieces of land in Chateau-Richer. He even bought one of 16 January 1674, which he quickly turned over to his son Mathurin the following October 13th.

Jean

He was born of 13 August 1610 at the same place as Mathurin. On his arrival at Quebec in 1635, at age 25, he too went into the family business.

In 1640 he obtained a concession of 7 arpents in river frontage by 126 arpents deep, at Chateau-Richer. From 1640 to 1652 he too bought and sold land in Chateau-Richer, but he always kept that original grant received in 1640.

Jean and Marguerite settled down on the arpents of land which had been conceded to them in 1640. A map of 1663 shows the place to measure 16 arpents to the east of Mathurin, between Jean Chapeleau and J. Lesot

Pierre

This one was born of 14 February 1612 at la Gagnonniere and was baptized at Ventrouze, three miles from his birthplace. He was 23 years old when he came to Canada and went into business with his brothers.

Just as the other two, he obtained a concession at Chateau-Richer, between Mathurin his brother and Jean Cachon junior. His was a large grant of 6.5 arpents on the riber by 126 arpents deep. On 13 May 1657, Pierre ceded a half arpent of his land to Nicolas Lebel, bordering that of Jean Cachon junior. He took it back on 29 December 1668.

Marguerite Gagnon, born 5 October 1598 at la Gagnonniere, sister of the three Gagnon brothers, also came to Canada. Marguerite was married at Ventrouze, France, on 3 February 1624 to Eloi Tavernier. After their marriage they lived at Saint-Malo de Randonnai, from where Eloi came. They had at least two girls; Marguerite, born in 1627 and Marie in 1632, both at Saint-Malo, France

In 1642 they sold their belongings in Saint-Malo and on the first of May 1644 they were in Quebec where their daughter Marguerite married Mace Gravel; he who was in business with the three Gagnons.

One also finds at Chateau-Richer, in 1647, the mother Renee Roger witnessing the marriage contract of Mathurin. And some years later, it was no longer a question of her being here, but the question was would she return to France? Pierre, her husband, had already died in France, between the dates of 16 December 1630, when he signed for the death of his brother Olivier, and 1633 where, in a notarial act Renee Roger was called the widow of Pierre Gagnon.

The name Gagnon

In the various documents in France, at Tourouvre or at Ventrouze, one finds the following written: Gangnon, Gaignon, Gaignon, Gasgnon or Gagnon. According to Dauzet, the sense of the name Gagnon could represent the mythical horned boat of Provence, or more likely in Normandy, a barnyard dog, nickname for a fierce man. The Gagnon family is one of the most numerous in French America. All of

the Gagnons whom I know are excellent people! It is a Gagnon who tells you this!

In addition to the alternate surnames of Belzile and Belisle, some of the Gagnon descendants have taken the name Le Sauvage.

Guyon was a mason, a well educated man. On March 14, 1634 at Mortagne he and his fellow countryman Cloutier signed an undertaking with Robert Giffard. In a ship commanded by Captain de Ville he left Dieppe at the end of May, 1634 and arrived at Quebec on Aug. 8, 1634. He settled at Beauport that same year, and a year or two later brought out his wife and children. When he received from Giffard an arriere-fief near the Riviere du Buisson, he assumed that nobiliary surname.

- B. Jean Guyon was trained by Jean Bourdon or Martin Boutet at a surveyor. He was the first to learn his trade in Canada. He was already in practice on April 12, 1662, with the title of surveyor for the seigneury of Notre-Dame-des-Anges. Subsequently (1667) he came to style himself "king's surveyor in this colony". He lived at Chateau-Richer where he had been given a grant of land in 1650.
- E. Francois Belanger, husgand of Marie Guyon, arrived in New France in 1636. He was an experienced mason. He built with rock and mortar solid habitations. His home was considered very important in the protection of the colony.

Hebert, Louis, apothecary, first officer of justice in New France, first Canadian settler to support himself from the soil, m. Marie Rollet; b. Paris 1575? d. Quebec, 1627.

According to his descendant, Couillard Despres, he was the son of a Louis Hebert who was apothecary at the court of Catherine de' Medici. Documents more recently discovered in Paris indicate that his father was Nicolas Hebert, an apothecary, and that Louis was born in the "Mortier d'Or, a house near the Louvre. The niece of Nicolas Hebert's wife married Jean de Biencourt de Poutrincourt, in 1590. This relationship would explain Louis Hebert's interest in the early settlements in Acadia and his presence in Du Gua de Mont's expedition.

Lescarbot, in Port-Royal (Annapolis Royal, N. S.) in 1606 speaks with respect of his skill in healing and his pleasure in cultivating the soil, and, on his map of that region, indicates an island and a river named for Hebert. In the summer of 1606 Hebert sailed with Champlain and Poutrincourt along the coast to the southwest seeking other sites suitable for settlement. Poutrincourt and Hebert were so attracted by what is now Gloucester, Mass., that they planted a clearing there to test the soil's fertility. Both hoped to bring their families to settle in the New World. On this voyage Hebert showed that, though intent on peaceful pursuits, he could be counted on for quick and courageous action in an emergency. With Champlain, Poutrincourt, and several others, he leaped from the ship into a small boat, unclothed, in the middle of the night, in response to frantic cries from some foolhardy men who, having defied orders and remained on shore, were being attacked by Indians. The "Jonas", arriving from France in June 1607, brought the unwelcome news that, because of the cancellation of de Monts's concessions, the company must return to France.

In 1610, Hebert was again in Port-Royal, with the group whom Poutrincourt hoped to establish there. As apothecary, he treated both French and Indian patients. Apparently meals as well as medicine received his consideration; he prepared and administered both to chief Membertou in his last illness. He was in charge of the settlement when, in 1613, Rene Le Coq de la Saussaye came with the Marquise de Guercheville's colonists, withdrew the two Jesuit fathers from Port-Royal, and sailed away to start a new settlement elsewhere. The capture of this expedition at Ile des Monts Deserts by the English that same summer was followed by their destruction of Port-Royal (November 1613), and once more Hebert was forced to return to France.

In the winter of 1616-17 he renewed acquaintance with Champlain who was in Paris seeking support for his colony at Quebec. This post, having survived for nine years. probably seemed to Hebert a safe place for settlers. especially as Champlain obtained for him a favourable contract from the fur-trading company in control of the St. Lawrence region. Relying on these promises -- 200 crowns a year for his services as apothecary, and food and shelter for his family while getting land cleared -- Hebert sold his house and garden in Paris and took his wife Marie Rollet and three children, Anne, Guillemette, and Guillaume, to Honfleur ready to embark. There he discovered that the company had no intention of honouring its agreement. The best he could obtain was a new contract, halving his salary and his land grant and stipulating that his family and his servant should be at the service of the company without pay. Having no alternative, he accepted and sailed 11 March 1617.

In Quebec his apothecary's skill and his small store of grain were a godsend to the sick and starving winterers. In spite of the company's demands on his and his servant's time, he succeeded in clearing and planting some land. Champlain, on his brief visit of 1618, found cultivated land "filled with fine grain" and gardens in which vlourished a variety of vegetables.

For many years Hebert was the only man besides Champlain himself who took any interest in cultivating land. The trading company did their utmost to discourage him. Both Champlain and Sagard say that the unlawful restrictions they imposed upon him and upon the disposal of his products prevented him from enjoying the fruits of his labours.

When in 1620 Champlain returned from France with (nominally) full authority over the colony, he gave Hebert responsibility in the administration of justice by appointing him king's attorney. In this capacity he signed the colony's petition to the king in 1621. Hebert enjoyed the confidence also of the Indians, whom he, in contrast to many of his contemporaries, considered as intelligent human beings lacking only education. Many instances bear witness to their respect and affection for him. There is some question of trade relations with Guillaume de Caen, but in view of the fact that the surname Hebert is a very common one, this may be a case of mistaken identity.

In 1622 he petitioned the viceroy for a title to his land and on 4 Feb. 1623 received the grant guaranteeing him possession. Known later as the fief Sault-au-Matelot, the land included sites at present occupied by the Basilica.

This title was ratified on 28 Feb. 1626 by the succeeding vicercy and some acres along the St. Charles-the fief Saint-Joseph, later known as fief de Lespinay--were added, both holdings to be enjoyed "en fief noble." Hebert had achieved his cherished ambition; he had brought under his control enough of the wild land of the New World to support himself and his family in independence. meadows along the St. Charles afforded pasture for cattle; on the higher ground he had grain fields, vegetable gardens, and an orchard planted with apple trees brought from Normandy. All this had been achieved in spite of the company's opposition. Moreover, it had been accomplished with hand-tools only, not even a plough. (It was not until a year after the death of Hebert, that land was worked with plough and oxen and agriculture on a larger scale could begin.)

The winter of 1626 he had a fall on the ice which proved fatal. He died 25 Jan. 1627 and was buried in the Recollet cemetery. In 1678 his bones still in their cedar coffin, were transferred to the vault of the newly erected Recollet chapel and with those of Brother Pacifique Duplessis were the first to rest there.

B. Couillard de Lespinay, Guillaume

carpenter, seaman, and caulker, son of Guillaume Couillard and Elisabeth de Vesins, son-in-law of Louis Hebert; and native of Saint-Malo or of the parish of Saint-Landry in Paris; b. c. 1591; d. 1663 at Quebec.

Couillard married Guillemette, daughter of Louis Hebert, at Quebec, about 26 Aug. 1621. By her he had 10 children, and because of the numerous descendants of these children Couillard appears in the genealogy of almost all of the old French-Canadian families.

He had come to Canada about 1613 according to Champlain, who spoke highly of him in 1628. Couillard was one of the frist to settle permanently in the colony. Louis Hebert, the first farmer, arrived at Quebec only in 1617. After his death in 1627, Couillard took over from him the farming of his lands, having inherited, through his wife, half of Hebert's estate. Moreover, in the same year (1627) Champlain also granted to Couillard, for personal reasons, "a hundred acres of land to clear and seed," which bordered on the St. Charles River. By 1632 Couillard had nearly 20 acres under cultivation, and in 1639 he owned a flour mill. On 8 July of the same year Hault de Montmagny appointed him a "clerk the settlers of Quebec." He had been the first person to make use of a plough, in the spring of 1628. In 1643 he

was making lime for the Compagnie des Cent-Associes.

At the end of June 1628 Champlain, alarmed by the approach of the English and the threat of famine at Quebec, decided to send someone to Tadoussac to repair and bring back a boat, for the purpose of moving unessential people out towards the Gaspe. Couillard, the only man capable of carrying out this operation, stubbornly refused to do it, despite his normal readiness to be of help. In dread of being slaughtered by the Indians, "he feared for his skin, and did not want to leave his wife, for fear of losing her."

When Quebec was captured in 1629, Guillaume Couillard's family was the only complete family that agreed to live under the occupation, and Champlain entrusted to it two young Indian girls, Charite and Esperance, whom he had adopted. After the French returned in 1632 Couillard continued to work unsparingly for the colony and to be held in high regard generally: he took part in the defence against the Iroquois, frequently piloted boats between Quebec and Tadoussac, and became churchwarden of the parish, after having given a part of his land for the reconstruction of the church. Since he could not write, he used as his mark a most original little design, which appears on several historical documents that have been preserved.

In December 1654, under Governor Jean de Lauson's administration, he was ennobled by the king, "on account of services rendered to the country of Canada." According to family papers, Couillard's coat of arms was "azure, a dove with wings outspread or, holding in its beak an olive branch proper," with the device: "Dieu aide au premier colon".

Guillaume Couillard died in his house on a 4 March 1663, and was buried in the chapel of the Hotel-Dieu in recognition of the gifts made by him to that institution. Three years later his widow sold his house and a good portion of his land to Bishop Laval, for the establishment of the seminary of Quebec. The site of the house is marked today by a cairn in an inside courtyard of the seminary, and Guillaume Couillard has his statue, the work of the sculptor Alfred Laliberte, near Louis Hebert's monument beside the city hall of Quebec.

Doubille and Casanovec Daily Life in Early Canada

Louis Hebert was the first man to try to think in terms of settling whole families. The prospective colonist sold his furniture, settled up his affairs and left for Honfleur. the point of embarkation, with his wife, three children and his brother-in-law. A last attempt was made to prevent his departure. The captain of the ship together with representatives of the newly-formed Company of Canada, refused to allow him to embark unless he would put himself under contract in their service. The conditions were draconian: Hebert might reclaim land, labour and sow, but the products of his harvest would go to the company. In exchange it would pay him "300 livres de Tours". What was more, the colonist must in no circumstances whatsoever trade in furs with the Indians; if he did so his entire property would be forfeit. Hebert despairingly gave in. He signed the agreement and embarked on April 17, 1617. After two months of a difficult voyage the "Saint Etienne" dropped anchor at Tadoussac. By August the first Canadian Family had arrived in Quebec. Further difficulties arose. Instead of the promised fifteen acres, Hebert received only seven. What is more the Sieurs de Caen persecuted him endlessly, fearing that he might interfer in their dubious transactions with the Indians.

But Hebert had no commercial instinct. Though disillusioned by human dishonesty and meanness he was not discouraged and with the help of some indians he immediately started building a cabin to house his family for the coming winter. He cleared some land and soon possessed a small patch of land whence he dispensed his ideas on medicine to other Whites living in the neighborhood who following his example, had already begun to cultivate the land.

In 1627 the courageous man fell from a scaffolding and then died from lack of care in the hard winter weather.

Helene Desportes

Helene Desportes, said to be the first white child born in New France, daughter of Pierre Desportes and Francoise Langlois; m. Guillaume Hebert 1634; d. 1675

The date of Helene's birth has not been definitely fixed. Dionne says that she came to Quebec with her parents in 1613, Sulte that she was born in Quebec about 1622. Statistics from other sources indicate that she was 14 years old in 1634, 38 in 1659, 46 in 1666, and 48 in 1667. Anne Hebert, according to Champlain had died in childbirth previous to 1620; but sincer there is no further mention of her child, it was presumably still-born. Eustache Martin was born in October 1621. If, however, we assume Helene's birthday to be 1620, which seems most probable, her claim is established as being the first white child born alive in the St. Lawrence region.

Her husband was Guillaume Hebert. About this only son of Canada's first settler little is recorded except an occasional instance of his helping the priests in their relations with the savages. Since he had inherited half his father's land, which included some acres on the St. Charles as well as the original site above the cliff, it is to be assumed that his chief occupation during his short life was the cultivation of his fields. He was but a little boy when he came to Quebec with his parents in 1617, therefore probably still in his twenties when he died in 1639. Three children were born of this marriage, one of whom died in infancy. The other two were a son Joseph and a daughter Francoise (b. 1638) who married Guillaume Fournier, 1651.

Helene's second husband was Notel Morin (1616-30), a wheelwright, who became one of the early pioneers of Montmagny. Their son Germain became one of the first pupils of the seminary of Quebec and was consecreated to the priesthood by Mgr Laval in September 1655, the first Canadian-born priest. Another son, Jean-Baptiste (1645-94) was a member of the Conseil Souverain. Helene died 24 June 1675.

XIII. Langlois, Noel Dictionary of Canadian Biography

Noel Langlois, pilot of the St. Lawrence River, early settler on the seigneury of Beauport; b. c. 1603 at Saint-Leonard in Normandy, son of Guillaume Langlois and Jeanne Millet; d. 15, July 1684.

Following the relinquishment of New France by the British in 1632, Robert Giffard, the seigneur of Beauport, persuaded Langlois to become a settler in the new land. It is probable that Abraham Martin dit L'Ecossais, the king's pilot at Quebec, and possibly related to him by marriage, greatly influenced his decision. Langlois and his future wife, Francoise Grenier (Garnier), left France with Giffard's prospective settlers in the spring of 1634 and arrived at Quebec on 24 June. Following his marriage at Quebec in July, Langlois settled at Beauport. Three years later he received from Giffard a grant of land in perpetuity. His wife, the mother of 10 of his 11 children, died in November 1665. In July 1666 Langlois married Marie Crevet, the widow of Robert Caron. Langlois himself died at Beauport in July 1684, survived by his widow and 8 of his 11 children.

Swiss by birth, Miville came to Canada via La Rochelle at a date that has not been established with certainty but that was previous to Oct. 28, 1649, on which date he, along with his son Francois, received from the governor, Louis D'Ailleboust, a grant of land in the seigneury of Lauson, which was later raised to the status of an arriere-fief. Miville apparently tried to entice some of his compatriots to Canada. In fact, on July 16, 1665, M. de Prouville de Tracy granted him along with his sons and four others persons a concession measuring 21 arpents by 40 at Grande Anse (La Pocatiere), naming the locality "the Canton of the Fribourg Swiss". This undertaking was unsuccessful. Miville stayed at Lauson until his death Oct. 14, 1669.

One of Miville's descendants died in Louisiana at the age of 120.

The following is from a detailed article by M. Jergens that appeared in the Memoires de la Society Genealogique. This is available at the Seattle Public Library.

Toward the middle of the 16th century there lived in the neighborhood of the Church of Saint-Gervais, in Paris, a candle-maker named Simon Pajot. He belonged to a family of Parisian bourgeoisie and had 10 brothers and sisters. His business was good and he had prospered not only in his business but in his wife, Jeanne Guerineau, who had given him 4 sons and 2 daughters. However, his principal merit in our eyes must be that he was the grandfather of two of the first Canadian colonists.

All the family seemed very united. At the death of the patriarch they grouped around his widow. The distribution of his property was done in a friendly manner. It consisted of several houses and other properties.

Jeanne Guerineau died in 1572. She named her son-in-law, Nicolas Hebert, as the executor of her estate.

Shortly after Jeanne's death, her son, Isaac, reached his majority. At that time in France it was 25 years. He questioned Nicolas Hebert's handling of the affairs. For a time the whole family turned against Nicolas and Jacqueline. After considerable litigation the matters were all finally taken care of and the family was once again reunited.

BIENCOURT DE POUTRINCOURT, Jean, French soldier: born France 1557, died Mery-sur-Seine 1615. In 1603 he came to Canada where De Monts made him a lieutenant, and in 1604 received a grant of Port Royal and established there a colony of which he took little care. The grant was confirmed in 1607, and at the same time the King urged Poutrincourt to labor for the conversion of the savages. Desirous of Keeping the Jesuits from Port Royal, he delayed their departure from France, sent back glowing accounts of his own missionary success, and welcomed the Jesuits very ungraciously. He went to France in 1612, and after the English left Acadia sailed thither in 1614, but without having done anything to rebuild Port Royal he returned to France later in the same year.

BIENCOURT DE POUTRINCOURT, Charles: b. 1583; d. 1624. Son of Jean de Poutrincourt. He accompanied his father to Port Royal in 1605. He visited France in 1611, created a stir at court by the announcement of Indian conversions and brought back with him Jesuit missionaries. He administered Acadia from 1611-23 and partially rebuilt Port Royal after its destruction by Argall.

From a paper published in "Memoires de la Societe Genealogique" by R. P. Alphonse Rajotte, O. M. I. A translation.

To his son, Jean, came the honor of perpetuating the descendance of the ancester Guillaume Pelletier. At 20 years of age he became engaged to Anne Langlois, then aged 10 years, daughter of Noel Langlois and of Francoise Garnier. The marriage took place November 9, 1649. Jean Pelletier was then 22 years and Anne Langlois had reached the age of 12 as required by church law.

The young couple settled at Beauport. He occupied the land located between that of his brother-in-law, Paul Vachon, notary, and of Martin Prevost. In the register of Quebec, is found the record of the baptism of Rene, 1659, Antoine, 1661, and Jean, 1663, sons of Jean Pelletier and of Anne Langlois.

After having cleared the land at Beauport he was granted Dec. 27, 1663 a piece of land on the Ile d'Orleans. November 14, 1665 he rented his land at Beauport to Guillaume Lisot, the one who was to marry his daughter, Anne, in 1670.

In 1670 Jean Pelletier sold his land on the Ile d'Orleans to Denis Jean and returned to his home at Beauport. He lived there 5 years.

On September 27, 1671 we find the record of the baptism of Charles and in 1674 that of Charlotte, son and daughter of Jean Pelletier. The Pelletier family now left Beauport for the seigneurie of Belle-chasse. The census of 1681 definitely places them at Riviere-Ouelle.

The name of Jean Pelletier is included in the list of patriots who in 1690 repulsed an attempted landing of Phipps at la Riviere-Ouelle.

Marie Wagner, born in 1839, married George Chaffman Aplin. She was sent at about the age of twelve to be a helper to Archbishop Blanchet's niece, his housekeeper, at St. Paul. She was fearful of Soulange Pelletier, afterwards known as Madame Lucier (Charles Lucier, her husband) who was said to have a rough tongue with her little helpers. Marie later found her words were worse than her deeds, and she learned to get along well. She also learned music from Father Blanchet and had some further education under his care.

Gelan married a French-Canadian named Lucier, in either Oregon City or St. Paul (Oregon Territory). No children were born of the marriage. She was always known thereafter in the family as "Madame Lucier". Gelan died in Vancouver in 1894 (should read Feb. 27, 1899), aged about 85 years. She was apparently the eldest of the three Pelletier girls. She is buried in the Catholic cemetery, Vancouver, Washington, beside her sister Henriette.

Note: There were many Luciers in Oregon. I have been unable to identify the parents of Charles.

Soulange Pelletier is mentioned in Oregon on July 16, 1848.

The Catholic Mission was to be established on the Cowlitz River. Accordingly the Vicar General (F. N. Blanchet) left Vancouver on December 12, 1838, in a canoe paddled by four Indians, and arrived at the Cowlitz settlement on Sunday, Dec. 16. He celebrated Mass in the house of one of the Canadian settlers, Mr. Simon Plomondon.

Simon Plamondon was one of the original settlers on Cowlitz Prairie. He was born in Quebec in 1800, left home at the age of fifteen, being tall and mature for his years, and journeyed west by way of New Orleans in easy stages. He was employed by the Hudson's Bay Company as a boatman and explored the Cowlitz Valley. He was associated thereafter with the Company Farm at Cowlitz until retiring to a farm of his own. The town of Toledo, Washington, approximate site, was known as Plamondon's Landing. He was several times married, having children by each alliance. His first wife was a native; his second Emelie Finlay, widow of Pierre Bercier; and his third Louise Henriette Pelletier, the niece of Archbishop Francois Blanchet. Simon was a large and handsome man, even in extreme old age; his daughter Marie Anne St. Germain recalled him fondly as "a very pretty man."

The following information on the Plamondon Family is taken from:

History of the Columbia River Valley from the Dalles to the Sea, Vol. II, Pages 723 and 724.

Simon Plamondon was one of the most prominent and influential citizens of the early days in this part of the country. He was born in Montreal, Canada, and came to Cowlitz Prairie in 1813 as the first factor of the Hudson's Bay Company's post there, carving through the first trail from what is now known as Long View to Puget Sound. He was with the Hudson Bay Company for many years, and helped to organize and afterwards operated the agricultural department for that concern. Later he served as United States Indian agent for all of this northwestern country until his death, which occurred in the early '80's, at the age of one hundred and four years. He was a member of the first territorial convention, the territorial legislature and the state constitutional convention, and it was he who discovered Frazer pass in British Columbia. His brother-in-law, Mr. Lucier, was a member of the historic Champoeg conference and, though a Canadian, advocated joining this territory to the United States. Simon Plamondon was married to Miss Henrietta Pelletier, a niece of Archbishop Blanchet, the first Catholic archbishop in the northwest, who was induced to come here mainly through the influence of Mr. Plamondon

who died in 1925, was born on Cowlitz Prairie, Washington in 1850 and was reared by his mother in the home of Archbishop Blanchet at Oregon City. He completed his educational training at Holy Angels College in Vancouver, and at the age of eighteen years went to San Francisco, California, where he was for several years employed in the office of C. P. Huntington. Later he was for a number of years with the street car company, and in 1880 returned to Washington and, located at Tumwater, was engaged in railroad construction work during his remaining active life. In 1868, in San Francisco, he was married to Miss Ellen Scanlon, who was born in County Kerry, Ireland, from which country she emigrated to the United States alone. She lived for awhile in Massachusetts, and then made the long voyage around Capte Horn to San Francisco, where she met Mr. Plamondon.

L. N. Plamondon received a good public school education, after which he taught in the schools of Thurston county, and also served four years as superintendent of the schools of Kelso, resigning that position in 1907 to enter the Kelso State Bank. He remained in that institution for five years, being advanced to the position of assistant cashier, and then came to Woodland and bought the controlling interest in the Woodland State Bank, of which he became president

In 1902, in Olympia, Washington, Mr. Plamondon was united in marriage to Miss Nellie E. Elswick, who was born in Missouri and who died February 4, 1927, leaving two children, Lois N., who is attending St. Mary's College, in Portland and George Riley, who is in high school. Mr. Plamondon served two terms as mayor of Woodland and was also a member of the city council, and while a resident of Kelso served six years as a member of the school-board. He is a member of the BPOE and the Kiwanis Club at Kelso and the Knights of Columbus in Portland

George F. Plamondon was born in Tumwater in 1886, attended the public schools and St. Martin's College, at Lacey. He worked in the woods for five years, and for about one year was connected with the Kelso Journal, after which he was in accounting work until 1908. He then entered the old Kelso State Bank, in which he became assistant cashier and remained there until the failure of the bank, in 1921, after which he came to Woodland and was a cashier of the Woodland State Bank for about a year, and was then made vice president, which position he still holds. In 1911 he was married to Miss Helen Carothers, who was born in Kelso, a daughter of F. M. and Annie (Robb) Carothers. The father came from Iowa in the early '80's and became a successful merchant at Kelso. Mr. Plamondon served two years as mayor of Kelso, and is a member of the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks and the Knights of Columbus.

France. and of Lealie (?) Francoise Navette, deceased, of the same place, on the one part; and Emilie Pelletier of-age daughter of Jean Baptiste Pelletier and of Rosalie Blanchet, both deceased of St. Francois district of Quebec. Canada, on the other part; Messieurs Francois Menes and Jean Francois Guerin having certified before us that the said Julien Bihan was free of all matrimonial engagements, and not having encountered, moreover any impediment, we have received their mutual consent to marriage and have given them the nuptial benediction in the presence of M. Guilliam Leclaire, priest, Jean Francois Guerin, Cuthbert Lambert, and of Charles Prevost. The two first have signed with us as well as the groom. Julien Marie Bihan.

The following information comes primarily from an article in the "Memoires de la Societe Genealogique" by P. Archange, O.F.M.

The first mention of Nicolas Pinel is found in the parish record of Sainte-Marguerite in La Rochelle, France, dated Sept. 29, 1630. It records his marriage to Madeleine Marraut. He is listed as the "son of the deceased Jean and of Thomasse De La Haye of Champagnelle, Normandy".

His wife's name is given as Madeleine Marraut, native of Bourgneuf, in Aunis, daughter of Mathieu Marraut and of Jeanne Gay. At that time the spelling of last names was not established. In accounts concerning her the spelling varies as to Marraut, Maraude, Maranda, and Maro.

This was a period of serious trouble. La Rochelle was a citadel of Protestantism. Cardinal Richlieu was determined to stamp out Protestantism. He laid seige to the town and by starving the people had cut the population from 20,000 to 5,000 in 1628 and 1629. The Protestants had destroyed the parishes of Notre Dame de Cogne, Saint Jean du Perrot, Saint Sauveur, Saint Barthelemi, and Saint Nicolas. Only the parish of Sainte Marguerite was left and served the people of the other parishes. However, the people maintained their identity with their original parishes. Therefore, both Nicolas and Madeleine gave their parish as Saint Sauveur.

The next records of the Pinel family at Sainte Marguerite's are of several baptisms. First was Antoine, baptized September 7, 1631, and according to the custom of the time he was given the first name of his godfather, Antoine Prieur. Next were Pierre and Gilles, twins, baptized February 28, 1635. The first had for a godfather Pierre Thibault and the second, Gilles Lagorce, merchant. Another Pierre was baptized in October 1636. His godfather was Pierre Souloigne, shoemaker. Another son born to this couple was Isaac. Antoine and the first Pierre presumable died before the mother went to Canada.

Pinel was a carpenter and was, no doubt, drawn to La Rochelle by the availability of work.

There is a record that he bought a house on Jan. 12, 1641 from Daniel Combault in La Rochelle.

New France, Acadia, in particular, was then the principal topic of conversation at La Rochelle. Charles de Menou d'Aulnay and Charles de St. Etienne de la Tour were battling in Acadia. D'Aulnay resolved to get the thing over with so he sent his representative to La Rochelle to recruit men. The first to respond were Jean Chaillot, navy carpenter, and four other builders: Nicolas Pinel, Louis Blanchard, Jean Perron and Pierre Janneau. They left April 5, 1645 to spend three years at Port Royal in Acadia. Note: Aulnay captured Madame de la Tour who died while his prisoner. Aulnay was drowned in 1650 after which La Tour married his widow thus uniting the conflicting claims.

Pinel named his wife his "protectoress general" (power of attorney) the same day he signed to go to Acadia. Shortly after he left his son Isaac was born

He returned to France in 1648.

In 1648 several Canadians returned to France to look for wives. Among them were Olivier Le Tardif and Zacharie Cloutier. They spoke much about Quebec and new adventure was too much for Pinel to resist.

He rented the property of Dame Anne Gasnier who wished to return to France for a year and did not want to leave her property without someone living there. This property at Monceaux near Sillery was none other than the old Hotel Dieu or convent which had been abandoned in 1644. Dame Gasnier acquired it Sept. 18, 1649.

Pinel entered into an agreement whereby he would repair the house. He was also to farm the property and the proceeds would be shared with Dame Gasnier.

His agreement with Dame Gasnier did not prevent him from working a piece of ground that he had been given near the river of Cap Rouge. He worked there accompanied by his son, Gilles, when April 27, 1651 he was surprised by a party of Iroquois. Let us copy the news as reported in the Journal of the Jesuites: "At 7:00 o'clock in the evening Nicolas Pinel and his son Gilles were attacked in their woods by two Iroquois who sought to take them alive. Boisverdun (Charles Gautier dit Boisverdun, a cousin) shot above them without wounding them. Mr. Nicolas and his son full of fear went down the mountain in order to save themselves".

As of this date, Gilles was perhaps the only one of the children of Nicolas Pinel who had come to Canada. The mother made a purchase in La Rochelle in the amount of 80 livres on June 30, 1651, from the merchant Jacob Roy. This merchandise was sent to Quebec on the "Saint-Joseph". We do not know just when Madeleine Marraut came to Canada.

Pinel found his property at Cap-Rouge too exposed to indian raids and requested another piece from the Jesuit Fathers at Sillery. Jan. 23, 1652 before Roland Godet. notary of the Seneschalship of Quebec, Jean Lemire and Mathurin Roy, witnesses, he received from R. P. Jean de Quen, superior of the residence of Saint Joseph in the Anse of Sillery, acting in the name of R. P. Paul Raguenear. Superior of the Canadian Mission, a piece on the river of two arpents frontage (1400 feet) by 20 arpents (14.000 feet) deep bounded on one side by Maurice Arrive and the other by Mathurin Trut. Our colonist took title to this ground. Rents were payable on the Feast of Saint John the Evangelist (December 27). Pinel also obtained the right to cut fir situated next to his property and to fish in front of his property with the condition that he give his neighbors the same privileges.

He was to began clearing during the month following the 13th of May, 1652. If he did not do this the Jesuites would be able to retake the property without indemnity and without formal process.

He was finally to permit the indians to use his woods for firewood and other uses and until the indians had their own mill he was to graind the grain they brought to him.

Nicolas Pinel did not settle on this land and it passed later into the hands of Jean Pelletier.

Pinel returned to Cap-Rouge where security seemed to be greater thanks to the protection of the new Seigneur Louis de Lauzon, Sr. de la Citiere, son of the governor. There had been frequent raids by the Iroquois. The following joined in a contract for mutual protection: Nicolas Pinel, Francois Blondeau, Jacques Archambault, Guillaume de Boysse, Charles Gaultier, Francois Boucher, Rene Mazeray and Antoine Martin. The contract was signed April 19, 1654. They would farm some land together. They were also free to farm separately. They were to began working together on May 1, 1654.

That summer passed with no problems. Their vigilence slackened. On Nov. 5 Michel Morin received two bullets in his head from the Iroquois. He died about three weeks later.

Peace returned. Then at the time of the harvest, Sept. 28, 1655, Nicolas Pinel received a mortal wound from an arrow.

When he died Pinel left three sons: Gilles, the oldest who perpetuated the name in New France, was 20 years old. Pierre was 18 and Isaac, the youngest was 10 years old.

The two oldest boys continued to farm with their mother despite indian squirmishes. The following year Gilles who had reached his 21st year wished to establish his own home. He bought a piece of land from Nicolas Patenoste on Nov. 29, 1656 for the small amount of 80 livres tournois. It was 2 arpents by 20 arpents between Sillery and Cap Rouge. About 8 months later, on July 28, 1657 he sold it to Guillaume Routier. He was planning to marry Anne Leodet, the widow of Jean Neveu. Jean Neveu had been taken by the Iroquois. Anne Leodet was the mother of two young girls. She owned two pieces of land and it was there that Gilles was to make his home following their marriage September 2, 1657.

On October 5, 1657 Madeleine Marrault was able to repay her debt to the La Rochelle merchant, Jacob Roy.

Feb. 10, 1659 Madeleine Marrault married Renaud Andre in the cathedral church of Quebec.

His mother having married a second time Pierre decided to establish his own home. Charlotte Fougerat arrived in Quebec from La Rochelle and on Nov. 27, 1662 they were married.

Three children were born to them, Francois, Nicolas and Andree. For reasons that are not explained Pierre was exiled from the colony for 20 years. Where he spent his exile is not stated.

Madeleine Marrault died at the age of 57.

When Pierre returned after his exile his mother was dead and his wife and children had disappeared, probably returned to France.

Isaac had also returned to France.

In 1692 Pierre married Marie Barbe Dupont. A daughter was born to them and named Marie Joseph.

The 1 October, 1852, by us priest undersigned has been buried in the cemetery the body of Marie Florence, wife of Charles Prevost, deceased the day before aged 43 years. Present Moll, Provost and Mesplie, who have not undersigned.

Florence (Prevost) Bell in writing the story of her family, makes the following statement concerning her grandfather:

His (Charles Prevost) son, Joseph Remy, was an altar boy at the wedding of James Casey and Ellen Fagan at the Church of St. John the Evangelist in Oregon City, May 19, 1853. Subsequently the son of Joseph Remy married the daughter of James and Ellen Casey.

His son, Charles, was buried in the Old Cemetery at St. Paul. Following is the parish entry:

The 11 April, 1854, we undersigned have buried in the cemetery of this mission the body of Charles son of Charles Prevost farmer, and of the late Marie Florence Peltier, of the same place deceased Saturday evening about 6 hours, the 8th of the month, at Oregon City in consequence of the explosion of the steamboat Gazelle at Canemeh about 7 hours in the morning of the same day, after have been administered (the Sacraments). Present Charles Prevost, father, Louis Prevost, brother of the deceased and a great number of friends.

F. N. Archbishop of Oregon City

He was mentioned many times as a witness or godfather during the following years.

The parish entry for his death is as follows:

June 1, 1895, I buried in the cemetery of St. Paul Charles Prevost, aged 84, who died May 30 in this same parish.

D. Faber, Rector

He was buried in the new cemetery of St. Paul. His gravestone, clearly readable in 1979, is as follows:

> Charles Prevost died May 19, 1895 aged 84 years native of Quebec Rest in Peace

Following is a copy of an obituary I found in a scrapbook at the Oregon Historical Society in Portland. I was not able to make a photocopy of the article. I do not know in what paper it appeared.

Death of a Pioneer

Woodburn, May 30--Charles Prevost, an old and respected pioneer, died at his son's house tonight. He was 86 years old and came to Oregon in 1852 as a missionary. He crossed the plains with Father F. X. Blanchet, now priest at Gervais, Oregon. With the exception of the last few years he has always lived at St. Paul, Or., being one of the first settlers on French Prairie. For the last few months he had been failing fast and had not been able to leave his bed.

There are obvious inaccuracies in this article. F. X. Blanchet came West in 1866. Charles Prevost came to Oregon by boat in 1852.

In the newspaper, the Woodburn Independent, dated Friday May 31, 1895 I found the following article:

PREVOST-In this city May 30, 1895--Chas Prevost aged 86 years. He was the father of Woodburn's pioneer hardware merchant Louis Prevost.

From the above two article it appears he was born in 1809. However, his gravestone indicates he died aged 84 years, which would have had him born in 1810 or 1811.
