Preface

Long ago when I was a little boy, my father mentioned to me that part of my ancestry was Chinook Indian and that I was registered with the Chinook nation. As time passed I became interested in my "roots". In 1994 my wife, Jeanette, and I learned that I am not registered as a Chinook Indian. We then attempted to learn of my ancestry. Thus, the following is small but never ending growth of the Barnes' Family Tree.

I knew my dad was born in Woodburn, Oregon. We surmised that maybe his parents were married in Oregon. So a trip to the Marion County courthouse revealed wedding certificates of my grandparents, Josiah Barnes and Emma Lavigueur (pronounced La-vee-air) and great grandparents Joseph Lavigueur and Adelaide LaChapelle. Parenthetically, Lavigueur was spelled many ways. The popular spelling is Lavigueur, although there is Lavigneur, Laviguere and Lavier.

My Great-Great grandmother was Marguerite Colvile also known as Marguerite, woman of Colvile or Marguerite, Colvile by nation, or Marguerite, Indian. The Colvile tribe were a Salishan people living between Kettle Falls and the Spokane river. My Great-Great-Great Grandmother was Josephte Nouite. The Nouites were a Kwakiutl tribe of northern Vancouver Island, much given to capturing and trading slaves. Like other tribes on Vancouver Island, they were expert canoemen and fishermen, warlike and dangerous to their neighbors and possessed of a distinctive art form developed to a high degree.

In the early 1800's the missionaries or priest used the patronymic system for Indian people baptized or married, that is , the father's tribal name became the surname. Thus, we have Marguerite Colvile and Josephte Nouite. However, both are not Chinook from what I know. So how was it my dad thought he was part Chinook? Well, my theory is that it came from my Great-Great-Great Grandmother whose name was Marguerite Tchinouk. She was the second wife of Etienne Lucier. My guess is that she raised Josephte Nouite's children as her own and influenced their heritage in the Chinook ways. So.. I'm not a Chinook, but mixture of other Indian nationalities!

Most of the information we found was located in seven books called the "Catholic Church Records of the Pacific Northwest".



Louis Pichet, an early fur trapper from Montreal, came west about 1820 and later was a courier for the Hudson's Bay Company. He married Marguerite Bercier and settled on a farm about two and a half miles southeast of St. Paul by the late 1830's. Marguerite Bercier was the daughter of Antoine Bercier, who had come west about 1810 with the Northwest Fur Company, and Emelie Fenlay, whose father, Francois Fenlay, had been an early fur trapper in the Northern Rocky Mountain area and had married Giget of the Cree Indian Nation some time prior to 1795.

By this time there was a rather large two-story log inn in St. Paul. This inn, which was owned and operated by Louis Pichet, was approximately three miles southeast of St. Paul on Mr. Pichet's property. It was known as "Louis Pichet's Log Inn", and was the stopping place for many people who were passing through or visiting in the St. Paul-St. Louis area.

Bercier, Marguerite

1819-1890

Marguerite Bercier married Louis Pichet in 1840 and became the mother of a large number of children, sometimes given as twenty-one, not all of whom lived to maturity, however. Her entire married life seems to have been spent on a farm near St. Paul. An early picture shows her a large, placid woman in a neat flowered print dress holding the hand of her husband, whose other hand grips an unmistakable bull whip. The pair are buried in the St. Paul Cemetery, their graves marked with good stones.

Pichet, Catherine

Catherine Pichet and Augustin Lambert (I) were already married with several children when they first appear in the records at Fort Walla Walla in 1847. These unrecorded children show up in later records of marriages and deaths. Although Catherine and Augustin Lambert were the parents of at least twelve children, infant mortality kept the number reduced so that the number at home at one time was not very large.

Pichet, Dominique
1837-before 1863
Dominique Pichet served in the Yakima Indian War, married Marguerite Lacourse in 1856, and died before 1863, when his widow married Elie Pellan.

Pichet, Emelie 1845-1919
Emelie, darkly handsome and with a deep contralto voice, was one of the three Pichet sisters who found husbands in three of five adventurous gold hunters coming up from California after the main rush was over. Her husband settled forn to prosperous farming on the Prairie; his sons

became merchants.

Pichet Esther

1839-1860

Esther married Joseph Lavigueur and died at the age of twenty-one.

Pichet, Louis (I)

1797-1876
The historian Bancroft, writing from newspapers of the day, said of Pichet that "he left Canada in 1817 with a company of 25 trappers, and wintered on the plains, losing 7 of the number, and arrived at Astoria in 1818. Pichet roamed about California and Oregon for 12 years in the Hudson's Bay Company. In 1832 he settled on a farm in the Willamette Valley, where he resided for over 40 years."

Pichet, Marie

1853-1879

Marie Pichet, daughter of Louis Pichet and Marguerite Bercier, married Felix DeLisle and died at the age of twenty-five. Both are buried with her parents in St. Paul Cemetery.

Pichet, Edouard

Edouard Pichet, called an Iroquois half-breed, was a champion athlete at Fort Nisqually in 1855, according to Huggins, who was in charge of the fort. Edouard was also something of a braggart and bully. Whether this is the same man as the Edouard of the Church record is not known.

Pichet, Louis (I) - dit Dupré

1797-1876

Louis Pichet (I) was a Hudson's Bay employee of long standing. He was with Work in 1831, being mentioned in "Pechette killed a bear", "chased Indians to recover stolen horses", and "took two beaver". He settled a claim along Champoeg Creek in 1839, where he and his wife, Marguerite Bercier, produced twenty-one children, not all of whom lived, however, Descendants are dispersed widely over the West today. Of his daughters, Esther married Joseph Lavigneur, Louise Soulange married James Comtois, and Marguerite married Narcisse LaFontaine.

Family recollection has it that one of his chief duties on brigades was that of "runner" carrying information to headquarters from brigades in the field.

Pichet, Louis (II)

1832-before 1857

Louis Pichet, the younger, married Geneviève Vandale in 1853 and died shortly, as his widow married Louis Poirier in 1857. One son, Louis (III) is recorded.


Pichet, Roc


Roc Pichet married a neighbor girl, Victoire Despard, lived for a time on the Grand Ronde Reserve and moved finally to Douglas County. In late life he suffered from asthma, and on a visit to eastern Oregon, where he had gone to seek relief in a drier climate, he died rather suddenly. He was buried in the cemetery of St. Andrew's Mission with a white marble slab, "Asleep in Jesus, peaceful rest, Where waking is supremely blest."

Lavigueur, Joseph

1838-

Between 1850 and 1853 Joseph Lavigueur appears as godfather or witness to various rites at Stel Maris at the mouth of the Columbia, at which time he would have been but thirteen years sixteen years old. His brother Hyacinthe also appears twice, though a mere child. Both the parents were dead, their father Hyacinthe in 1846 and their mother Marguerite Colville in 184 Joseph married Esther Pichet at St. Louis in 1859; she died a year later. He then married Ad laide Lachapelle in 1865, and reared numerous children.

Lavigueur, Hyacinthe I -1846 Lavigueur was in the West as early as 1831, occasionally appearing as Desloge or Delozhe. He and Marguerite Colville were married in the big wedding of 1839, when the priests made regular many previous unions. He was by trade a farmer and carpenter, "a good one, and he made a good living". He is recalled also as having made pottery utensils as well as kettles and other ironwork articles for the home. Heavy lifting in the brick kiln at the St. Paul church then under construction caused his death. He was the first French Canadian to be buried from the church for which he had given his life; A daughter Josephte was a ten-year-old pupil in the

Sisters' School at St. Paul in 1850, one of the few whose names are preserved to us. Hyacinthe Lavigneur died on November 10, 1846, and was the first French Canadian inhabitant to be buried from the new brick church, dedicated a few days before;

Joseph married Esther Pichet at St. Louis in 1859; she died a year later. He then married Adelaide Lachapelle in 1865, and reared numerous children.

Lavigueur, Josephte 1840-1931 Both Josephte's parents had died when she was a small child. The four children were scattered about wherever they could find homes; Josephte (Josephine) was placed in the Sisters' School at St. Paul, where she remained until the school closed in 1852. Thereafter she worked in the Newell and Bergevin homes, even after her marriage to Louis Bernier at the age of nineteen. Her lot was harder than that of many pioneer women, hard though the average may have been. She supported her children by any sort of work to be had, including the care of a leprosy patient, a ward of the government. Yet her ability to surmount difficulties with courage and optimism is the trait of character most fondly recalled by her family: "There was one ingredient we cherished worth noting for her descendents—it was her buoyant, happy, loving spirit." She was later married to Cyrille Richter in a union that did not work out well, to Andrew Northern, and lastly to William Moore. She lived out her long life as "Grandma Moore" in Montesano, Washington.

Lavigueur, Hyacinthe II Young Hyacinthe appears as godfather at the baptism of a native at Stella Maris in 1853, though but eleven years old. Both his parents had died, and he and his older brother Joseph were living at the coast, perhaps working as hands in the fisheries there. In his later years he lived and died in an "old folks' home" near Omak, Washington.

Lachapelle, Andre

This Andre Lachapelle should not be confused with the Astor man of the same name who was killed on the Snake River in 1814 in the Reed party. They may possibly have been related, but were not father and son. Andre, the younger, is said to have been employed as a blacksmith (his old portable anvil is still in the family) and boatman by the Hudson's Bay Company from 1817 to 1841, when he retired to a claim just north of St. Louis. He married Adrienne Lucier the same year. He died in 1881 in the newly established St. Vincent's Hospital. His grave in St. Louis Cemetery is marked with a good marble slab, although that of his wife is not. His obituary in The Oregonian calls him "the oldest pioneer in Oregon", and credits his age as a full century; however, his tombstone states, no doubt more accurately, that he died at "79 yrs. 1 mo. 29 da".

Lucier, Adrienne
1824-1919

Adrienne, second daughter of Etienne Lucier, was born at Fort Vancouver while it still stood on the bluff above the Columbia. She married Andre Lachapelle in 1841 and was the mother of twelve children. She seems to have been a woman of much strength of character, fondly remembered as "Old Grandma", and a midwife, "delivering half the children on the Prairie". She herself said she had ridden as far as "the foot of the mountains" on such errands. She is buried, unmarked, beside her husband at St. Louis.

Felicite, named for her mother's sister, Felicite Lucier Manson, lived and died at St. Louis. She married Amadee Seguin in 1857. Three of her six children died in infancy; she herself died in 1872 at the age of thirty, at St. Louis.


Lucier is generally conceded to have been the first farmer in Oregon. He was a member of the Hunt overland party, having joined at Mackinac in 1810. He remained in the West as a freeman, and is mentioned throughout the records and journals of the time. About 1828 or 1830 he settled on a claim adjacent to the old Willamette Fur Post above Champoeg. He became a leader in church and government affairs, one of two undisputed Canadians who voted affirmatively for the Provisional Government in 1843. He was twice married to natives, six children being born to his first wife Josephte Nouite, and two to Marie Marguerite Tchinouk. He is one of twelve honored by a bronze plaque at Old St. Paul Cemetery, where he lies unmarked.

Lucier, Etienne II

1844-1921
Etienne Lucier, Jr. usually known as Stephen (the English equivalent of Etienne) was the youngest child of Etienne, Sr., and Marie Marguerite. He never married, but lived alone with his little dog Bismarck in a cabin not far from the home of his brother Pierre. He lost an arm by gunshot in middle age. The Marion County Census of 1870 mentions that "Steve Lucier, Indian, aged 23" was working on the farm of B. F. Harding.

Pierre was the son of Etienne Lucier by his second wife, Marie Marguerite. All his life was spent as a farmer not far from his birthplace on French Prairie. He married Thais Senecal, daughter of Gideon Senecal and Lucie DuCharme, in 1871, and reared a numerous family. He is remembered by present residents on the Prairie as "a short, very wide" man, fond of smoking Bull Durham, cards, and swimming.

Lucier, Etienne I

Lucier is generally conceded to have been the first farmer in Oregon. He was a member of the Hunt overland party, having joined at Mackinac in 1810. He remained in the West as a freeman, and is mentioned throughout the records and journals of the time. About 1828 or 1830 he settled on a claim adjacent to the old Willamette Fur Post above Champoeg. He became a leader in church and government affairs, one of two undisputed Canadians who voted affirmatively for the Provisional Government in 1843. He was twice married to natives, six children being born to his first wife, Josephte Nouité, and two to Marie Marguerite Tchinouk. He is one of twelve honored by a bronze plaque at Old St. Paul Cemetery, where he lies unmarked.

Husband

Lucier, Felicité

1814 c.-1867

Eldest daughter of Etienne Lucier and Josephte Nouité, Felicité married Chief Trader Donald Manson about 1828. As Manson was non-Catholic and since most of their married life was spent in remote posts, no records are found until her death in 1867 after they had retired to a farm at Champoeg. She was the mother of eight children. Her grave in Old St. Paul Cemetery is unmarked, as are all in the old burial ground.

3 Daughter's

Lucier, Adrienne

1824-1919

Adrienne, second daughter of Etienne Lucier, was born at Fort Vancouver while it still stood on the bluff above the Columbia. She married Andre Lachapelle in 1841 and was the mother of twelve children. She seems to have been a woman of much strength of character, fondly remembered as "Old Grandma", and a midwife, "delivering half the children on the Prairie". She herself said she had ridden as far as "the foot of the mountains" on such errands. She is buried, unmarked, beside her husband at St. Louis.

Lucier, Pélagie

1827-1856

Pélagie married François Bernier in 1843. Her home was a farm near Champoeg, which she managed alone for five months while her husband was in California during the gold rush. She was the mother of seven children; she is buried, unmarked, in Old St. Paul Cemetery.

3 SON'S

Lucier, Louis (Louison)

1832-

Louis was the eldest son of Etienne Lucier and Josephte Nouité. He married Celestine Gervais, daughter of Jean Baptiste Gervais and his métisse wife, Marie Lucier. He was schooled in the early Church school on the Prairie, to the extent that he wrote French and at least sketchy English. Celestine died within the year (1852), and Louis himself was given as "deceased" prior to 1860.

Lucier, Michel

1025

Michel, second son of Etienne Lucier, disappears from the record after 1860. He evidently attended the Jesuit school at St. Paul as his signature appears "Michel Loucier" on various documents.

Lucier, Joseph

1838-1907

Joseph was the third son of Etienne Lucier and his first wife, Josephte Nouité. He was six months old at the time of his mother's death. In 1857 he married Louise Martineau, daughter of Pierre Martineau. Joseph and Louise (Marie) had fourteen children, most of whom reached maturity. They lived near Woodburn and were influential in bringing the Church to the remote Crooked Finger region. Both are buried at St. Paul.

Nouite, Josephte

1800 c.-1840

Josephte was early married to Etienne Lucier, one of the Astorians who arrived in 1811 or 1812. She was the mother of six children, Felicite (Manson), Adrienne (Lachapelle), Pelagie (Bernier), Louis, Michel and Joseph, who was a small infant at the time of her death. Her widower remarried during the year; his sons Pierre and Etienne II were from this second marriage.

Wife

Nouité (Newette, Nouette) Tribe

The Nouité were a Kwakiutl tribe of northern Vancouver Island, much given to capturing and trading slaves. Like other tribes on Vancouver Island, they were expert canoemen and fishers, warlike and dangerous to their neighbors, and possessed of a distinctive art form developed to a high degree.

Lucier, Antoine, Sr. -before 1848 Antoine Lucier, Sr., was a brother to Etienne Lucier, Sr. He was born in Canada and was with the North West Company in British Columbia, where he married Charlotte Desnover.

BROTHER to Etienne LUCIER I

Lucier, Antoine, Jr.

Antoine Lucier, Jr., was born in British Columbia to Antoine Lucier, Sr., and Charlotte Desnoyer, apparently the metisse daughter of another engage. His wife was Julie Aubichon, daughter of Alexis Aubichon and Marianne Chinook, also given as "Wales" and as "Elmermach" (given name). Of several known children, Marianne (Mary) married Louis Ducheney, Emelie married one Cashel, and Alexis married Emma Millet. Antoine's widow Julia married twice more, once to Roberts and once to Price, to whom she bore several children.

son to Antoine .

-before 1839 Basile was probably a brother to Etienne and the other Luciers in the Northwest. Basile was with the North West Company as early as 1807 at Rocky Mountain House, Kootenay House and others. He was with Thompson in the Rockies in 1808-9, where his wife died, leaving four children. He went with the Hudson's Bay Company after the coalition. One brigade leader called him a bully; on the other hand, Ross Cox said he was extremely polite and "one of the best and most obedient men in the brigade". A daughter Marguerite was baptized in 1838 at the age of 24; the Marie Lucier who married Jean Baptiste Gervais in the Flathead country was probably another of the four children mentioned earlier.

Brother to Etienne LUCIERT

Joseph Lucier, the elder, may have been a brother of the well-known Etienne Lucier, as their family lines seem to intertwine later. Joseph had been a voyageur with the North West Fur Company at Fort des Prairies on the upper Saskatchewan in 1804. The Henry-Thompson Journals list him at Fort Vermillion in 1809 with "1 tent, 2 men, 1 woman, 1 child". The child was probably his daughter Angélique, born about 1803, who married Saloy. He was at White Earth House in 1810, "1 tent, 2 men, 2 women, 2 children". The mother of Angélique was a Cree woman called Wewepihawisk, who was probably the same Cree mother of a son Iean Baptiste, born about 1815, whose true name was Lucier, he himself said, but often called Gardipe or Garisy. The supposition would be that Joseph Lucier had died and the Cree mother had married a Gardipe.

Brother to Etienne

Lucier, Jean Baptiste Gardipe

1815-1850 Jean Baptiste Lucier was the son of Joseph Lucier, who had been in the North West Fur Company in western Canada for many years, and Wewepahawisk, a Cree. Jean Baptiste went by the name of Gardipe, Garissie, etc., apparently the name of a stepfather. He was a well-known scout and guide in the Oregon Country until his death at the age of thirty-five. Five recorded sons were born to him and his wife, Catherine DeLore; only Paul is known to have survived.

Lucier, Paul Paul was the eldest son of Jean Baptiste Lucier dit Gardipe, and sometimes Paul went by the latter name, though he averred his true name was Lucier. 

Bernier, François

Bernier was a miller employed at McKay's grist mill on Champoeg Creek in 1844. He took a land claim near the heart of the Prairie in 1845. During the California gold rush he was absent for five months, leaving his wife, Pélagie Lucier, and their three small children on the claim. In all, eight children were born to them. Pélagie died in 1856. Two years later Bernier married Marie Despard, to whom two more children were born. He died in 1876 and was buried beside his first wife in the Old St. Paul Cemetery, unmarked.

Husband

Francois Bernier, a native of Maskinonge, Canada, came to St. Paul in the early 1840's. He worked as a miller and had a farm about two miles south-southeast of St. Paul shortly after arriving. He married Etienne Lucier's daughter Pelagie in 1843.

Pélagie married François Bernier in 1843. Her home was a farm near Champoeg, which she managed alone for five months while her husband was in California during the gold rush. She was the mother of seven children; she is buried, unmarked, in Old St. Paul Cemetery.

Norbert Bernier, eldest son of François Bernier and Pélagie Lucier, grew up to marry Thérèse Rivet. Seven children were born to them. Thérèse died of tuberculosis while living in a tent, the prescribed treatment in such cases, at Champoeg. Her husband went to live with a son at Oregon City. On a visit to Champoeg he became ill, returned to Oregon City, and died in a few days. Both he and Thérèse are buried with other members of their family in the Champoeg Cemetery.

Bernier, Marie

1845-1892
Marie was the eldest daughter of François Bernier and Pelagie Lucier. She married Amadée Choquette in 1859 and was the mother of 15 children. A photograph taken a year or two before her death at the age of forty-seven shows her a lovely, slender woman with large dark eyes in a thin face, looking quite like her aunt Adrienne Lucier Lachapelle; their charm may have been a family inheritance of all the Lucier women whose likenesses are not known. "Marie, beloved wife of A. Choquette" reads the stone for her and her son Pierre in the St. Paul Cemetery.

Husband of Marie Bernier Choquette, Amadeé

Amadeé Choquette came to Oregon from Canada during the 1850's and married Marie Bernier at St. Louis in 1859. He bought a farm south of St. Paul, rolling and well-watered, where he raised fine horses for racing, the popular sport of the times. An 1890 photograph shows a large, prosperous looking man, a beautiful wife and a family of fifteen unusually handsome children. Marie Choquette, "Beloved Wife", died in 1892. Amedee Choquette was fatally burned on his way home from town with a can of kerosene in the back of his hack one windy October day. A cigar spark set the straw and kerosene afire. The team dashed madly for home with the blazing equipage while the old man fought to control them until his hands and the leather reins were

fused together; he died the next morning. During that last dreadful night his concern was for his scorched horses, which survived.

On July 25, 1859, Amadee Choquette, a native of St. Gregoire, Montreal District, Canada, who had come to St. Paul in the late 1850's, married Marie Bernier of St. Louis, Oregon. She was born in St. Paul and was the daughter of the François Berniers.

Amadee Choquette was born about 1840 in St. Gregoire, Montreal, Canada. He was the son of Charles Choquette and Elinor (Seguin) Choquette. As a youth he studied for the priesthood, but eventually decided that he would rather go west. He arrived in St. Paul when a young man in his teens, and eventually purchased a farm about two and a half miles southeast of St. Paul.

Marie Bernier was born in St. Paul April 30, 1845. Her father, Francois Bernier, Jr., was the son of Francois Bernier and Genevieve (Layole) Bernier of Maskinonge, Canada, where Francois, Jr. had been born. After Francois Bernier, Jr. came to St. Paul he worked as a miller and had a farm. He went to California during the gold rush. Marie Bernier's mother was Pelagie Lucier, a daughter of Etienne Lucier and Josephite of the Nouete Indian tribe. Pelagie was born in 1826.

Etienne Lucier was a French Canadian who had come west with the Astor Expedition's Hunt Party in 1811 when

he was 18 years old. His farm, about three and a half miles north of St. Paul, was one of the first farms in the Oregon Country. In late 1838, Etienne Lucier and his neighbor, Pierre Belleque, met Father Blanchet when he arrived at Fort Vancouver when he came to French Prairie to bless the mission church. Lucier and Belleque organized the notification to the French Canadians that Father Blanchet would be at the church on January 6, 1839. At the meeting in Champoeg on May 3, 1843, Etienne Lucier was one of the fifty-two who voted for the establishment of a provisional government.

Amadee Choquette, 19, and Marie Bernier, 14, were married in St. Louis, Oregon on July 25, 1859. The witnesses were Etienne Lucier; Julie Gervais; Andre Lachapelie, uncle of the bride; and Amadee Seguin, uncle of

the bridegroom.


After the wedding the Choquettes lived on their farm. They had some of the first and finest farm machinery in the St. Paul area. They also bred trotting horses. Two of the best were "Emigrant" and "Champoeg". The Choquette farm was a very successful operation and eventually the Choquettes became relatively wealthy. Three of their daughters married sons of Honore (Henri) Picard of St. Paul. Celina Choquette married John Picard, who as a youth worked for the Jette store and in the harvests in eastern Oregon. He later built a home on his farm in St. Paul, had a ferry across the Willamette, and had the main blacksmith shop in St. Paul. One of John Picard's grand-daughters, Delight (McHale) Lorenz, became an actress and has been prominent in theater circles in Portland for many years.

The Amadee Choquettes had 15 children, as follows: Mary, who married Henri Picard II; Celina, who married John Adolph Picard; Eleanor (Dolly), who married Jewell Picard; Delia, who married Joseph Delysle; Mamie, who married Chester Knight; Rose, who married Roger White; and Amadee, Fique, Theresa, Leo, Charles, George, Pierre, Felix and Freeman.

Amadee Choquette died at age 68 on October 7, 1908. Mrs. Choquette died when 47 years of age on June 16, 1892.

The Choquettes were a prominent early day St. Paul family. Their children, who were talented musicians, loved social affairs and were very happy people. They had a baseball diamond on their farm, and a piano from France was one of the family's prized possessions. Neighbors would gather at their farm in the evenings and on Sundays for athletic events, singing and dancing. The entire family had a great love for horses.

Amadee Choquette carried a scar on his arm. When he was coming across the plains he encountered a grizzly bear which chewed on his arm and then hid him by covering him with leaves. As soon as the bear was a safe distance away Mr. Choquette got up and left quickly so he wouldn't be there when the bear returned, but the bear had left its mark.

Chinook Tribe

"The Chinooks are scattered along the Columbia from this fort (Vancouver) to the Pacific Ocean. Before the year 1830 they formed the most numerous as well as the richest nation of this entire part of the continent . . . proud and haughty . . . but there came a disastrous malady (apparently malaria) which made such terrible ravages among them that it cut down almost ninetenths. The scourge of God having stricken these unfortunate savages because of their abominable lives . . . "

Father Blanchet

The Chinook language formed the chief Indian basis for the trade jargon used up and down the Pacific coast. Their principal food was salmon, wapato and berries. Their houses were framed buildings of cedar planks and bark, well-made.

Colvile Tribe

The Colviles were a Salishan people living between Kettle Falls and the Spokane River. Once they had been a large tribe estimated to have numbered several thousand in 1850, but by 1904 they had been reduced to a few hundred on the Colvile Reserve.

Okanogan Tribe

The Okanogans were a Salishan tribe of north-central Washington and southern British Columbia.

Spokane Tribe

The Spokanes were one of the five tribes in the upper Columbia region called by Father Blanchet "Gens des Lacs" in his reports.

Nouité (Newette, Nouette) Tribe

The Nouité were a Kwakiutl tribe of northern Vancouver Island, much given to capturing and trading slaves. Like other tribes on Vancouver Island, they were expert canoemen and fishers, warlike and dangerous to their neighbors, and possessed of a distinctive art form developed to a high degree.

Fort Vancouver (Hudson's Bay Company)

Shortly after the coalition of the North West and the Hudson's Bay Companies, Headquarters of the Columbia Department were moved from Fort George at the mouth of the river to a new location on the north bank a hundred miles upstream. A better climate, closer proximity to the interior fur regions and nearby plains suitable for farms were some of the reasons leading to the change. In 1825 a palisaded enclosure was set up on the bluff above the flood plain at the present Vancouver, Washington. In 1828 it was rebuilt on the plain below to lessen the distance between the ship landing and to avoid hauling domestic water up the hill. Although the natives were peaceful, the tradition of enclosing shops, stores and living quarters within a 14-foot high stockade of upright timbers was still observed. Outside the palisades were barns, storage sheds, a crude hospital and a village of cabins for the workmen. A bastion at the northwest corner gave the theoretical protection to the establishment, but the cannon were rarely fired except to salute approaching or departing ships. The custom of designating trading posts as forts was chiefly a usage come down from earlier times when protection had been necessary. Fort Vancouver, from which Chief Factor McLoughlin had controlled a vast area for the Company, was officially proclaimed the property of the United States Army when Chief Trader James Grahame handed over the keys to Captain Rufus Ingalls in 1860.

THE HUDSON'S BAY COMPANY AND FRENCH CANADIAN FARMS

By 1829, some of the men who were married and had families wanted to obtain land for farming. This, however, was against the policy of the Hudson's Bay Company, which was virtually the only source of agricultural seeds. The company, being English, operated in accordance with Great Britain's territorial interests and goals.

Dr. John McLoughlin was the manager of the Oregon Country operations for the Hudson's Bay Company. His headquarters was at Fort Vancouver. He was later to be-

come known as "Father of the Oregon Country".

In 1829, Dr. McLoughlin convinced the company headquarters in London that the agricultural seed policy should be slightly relaxed. As a result he was able to give agricultural seeds to three men who had come with the Astor Party -two French Canadians and an Englishman. Each of these men had married a daughter of Coboway, a chief of the Clatsop Indian tribe living just south of the Columbia River where it enters the Pacific Ocean. The two French Canadians chose farming sites on French Prairie and were followed each year thereafter by additional ex-fur trappers who likewise started farms. By 1838, there were 26 farms in the area, and most of them were operated by French Canadians with Indian wives. By that time the four most prominent French Canadian settlers were Etienne Lucier, Joseph Gervais, Louis Labonte and Pierre Belleque. Lucier, Gervais and Labonte had arrived with the Astor Party in 1811-1812 and Belleque had come with the Northwest Fur Company in 1818. Joseph Gervais married Yaimust of the Clatsop Indian tribe and Louis Labonte married her sister, Kilakotah. Yaimust and Kilakotah were daughters of Coboway, Chief of the Clatsop Indian tribe. As a young girl Kilakotah, the chief's eldest daughter, had probably seen Lewis and Clark. Etienne Lucier married Josephite of the Nouete Indian tribe. Pierre Belleque married Genevieve

St. Martin, daughter of Joseph St. Martin, an early fur

trapper, and a Chinook Indian woman.

Jacques Servant, a native of Montreal, who came west about 1812-1815, married Josephite of the Okanagan Indian tribe in the early 1820's and had a farm one mile south-southeast of St. Paul by the late 1830's. Augustin Raymond, a native of Montreal, who came west in the early 1830's, had a farm about a mile and a half south-southeast of St. Paul by about 1835 and married Jacques Servant's daughter Marie in 1843. Louis Bergevin, a Canadian native, came west in the early 1840's and had a farm two miles south of St. Paul by the middle 1840's. He married Jacques Servant's daughter Madeline shortly after her first husband, Charles Jeaudoin, died in 1848.

Louis Pichet, an early fur trapper from Montreal, came west about 1820 and later was a courier for the Hudson's Bay Company. He married Marguerite Bercier and settled on a farm about two and a half miles southeast of St. Paul by the late 1830's. Marguerite Bercier was the daughter of Antoine Bercier, who had come west about 1810 with the Northwest Fur Company, and Emelie Fenlay, whose father, Francois Fenlay, had been an early fur trapper in the Northern Rocky Mountain area and had married Giget of


the Cree Indian Nation some time prior to 1795.

Among the largest landowners in the St. Paul area in 1879 were the St. Paul Mission, August Raymond Heirs, James Coleman, W. F. Davidson and John Coleman, James McKay, C. L. Bergevin, Dieu Donne Manegre, Amadee Choquette, E. J. Harding, Henry Picard, Hugh Cosgrove, John Cooke, Peter Clary, Andrew Murphy, J. B. P. Piette, T. Wiggins, Frank Smith, L. Prevost, Simon Connor, John D. Kennedy, Dr. John Brentano, J. W. Smyth, Matthew Murphy, George Aplin, Charles F. Ray, Peter Kirk, William Trevor, John Gearin, S. Peletier, Henry Oahslager, Edward Coffee, J. B., L., and A. J. Bergevin, J. Belleque, E. N. Doupierre, James Coyle, Barney Kennedy Estate, John Kennedy, Jr., John Johnson, and Thomas Coleman.

The winter of 1879 was the coldest since 1861, and no winter like it was to occur again until 1919.

Many citizens in the area were occupied making rails for rail fences, which were gradually honeycombing the St. Paul area. Tens of thousands of rails were required because, besides enclosing the farms, they also divided them into fields. (Approximately 25,000 ten foot long wooden rails were required to enclose a 320 acre farm and divide it into 40 acre fields. Most of the rails were made by sawing fir trees which were about eight inches in diameter into ten foot lengths, and then splitting them lengthwise with an ax into four pieces called rails.)

By 1890, the horse-propelled threshing machines were disappearing. There were at least six steam-propelled threshing machines in the St. Paul area. Some were moved by horses, and others were moved by steam engine. They were owned by Frank Coleman and James Cooke, Thomas Kerr, Gearin and Pillette, John Kennedy, William McKay and Nicholas Gooding.

The community had a 25 member band which was said to have been one of the better bands in Marion County. Among the members were three Goodings, two Colemans,

Bert Pelland, Jack Davidson and John Hughes.

The town also had four baseball teams. Among the better players were Henry and Louis Ernst, Frank Coleman, Alfred Lambert and William Murphy. (In 1905, two of these baseball players, Frank Coleman and William Murphy, would hire the Goerdle Brothers to "grub" some land just south of the city limits for a baseball field. The cleared land became the St. Paul Baseball Field and three boys, Curtis Coleman, Herman Pillette and Ted Pillette, who got their start in baseball there, became major league baseball players. The converted baseball field became St. Paul Rodeo Grounds in 1935.)

The St. Paul area residents met many challenges in their relatively prosperous community. The families were still churning their own butter, making their own candles, sewing their own clothes from goods which could be purchased, splitting rails by the thousands for rail fences, and digging their own wells. There were great hardships and most families lived in log houses. Because of the great demand for their produce due to the California gold rush and the 1851 discovery of gold in Jackson County, Oregon, everyone was busy trying to produce as much as possible. The ratio between the French Canadian-Indian families and the American immigrant families was beginning to change. When the Americans arrived they either took a claim on unclaimed land or purchased part or all of a French Canadian land claim. Apparently the French Canadians were quite willing to sell land, especially at the high prices that were being offered by the Americans. The pattern was to continue for many years. An independent spirit, a friendly nature and a sense of humor were becoming established as part of the character of the community throughout these early years. Gold rushes, ferries, flatboats, keelboats, steamboats and a railroad were to come and go; but the character and personality of the St. Paul community were to remain.

By 1866, several of the residents of St. Paul had fairly large homes. They were built of lumber rather than brick because lumber was so readily available. By this time, not only were local sawmills operating but, as previously mentioned, square-headed nails were being made in St. Paul. The large houses became the center of social life. The local young people would arrive at a home late Saturday afternoon and would have dinner in the early evening. About 10:00 P.M. they would start dancing, continuing until about 3:00 A.M. The next morning they would go to church. After having the noon meal and socializing they would return to their homes Sunday evening. The various families would take turns hosting these parties.

The mission and some of the farms had baseball diamonds where people would gather to play baseball, pitch horse-shoes, have foot races and pole vault. Almost everybody was interested in horses and horse racing. Amadee Choquette had a stock farm and bred trotting horses. Two of the best were "Emigrant" and "Champoeg". Most of the residents rode horses. Many evenings individuals would ride to a neighbor's place and spend several hours visiting. So, although everyone had to work hard, they found much to

enjoy in their community.




Left: Second Church at St. Louis before Restoration.










Cemetery, Old, St. Paul

1839-1888 The original cemetery at St. Paul was nominally closed in 1875, and a larger one, still in use, established a short distance to the southeast. The old cemetery was still used by those families whose earlier members had been buried there, one of the last burial to be recorded being that of Adolphe Chamberland in 1888. In all, five hundred thirty-three interments were recorded and 12 removals to the new cemetery. In the overlapping period when both cemeteries were in use, the priest noted "N.C." or "O.C." in the margin of the register. The original plot was perhaps diminished by later roadbuilding and the remaining stones discarded during a clean-up of the neglected cemetery during the 1930's. Nothing now remains but a grassy plot with a central cross and a boulder bearing a bronze plaque.




Blessing of the Cemetery at Willamette (St. Paul)


Main Street, St. Paul, about 1906. Front to back: Kirk store, Miles McDonald house, Old Cemetery just beyond small white house in rear.

Most of the French Canadians were Catholics, but there were no priests or Catholic churches in the area. Therefore, during the 1831-1835 period the French Canadians petitioned the Catholic Church for priests. At the suggestion of Dr. John McLoughlin, petitions were sent to Monsignor Provencher in Red River, Winnipeg, Canada, on July 3, 1834, and again on February 23, 1835. The Hudson's Bay Company had originally opposed this but Dr. McLoughlin had persuaded them to relent. The farmers and Indians started to build a church on French Prairie. The log church was completed in 1836, but three years were to pass before the arrival of a priest.




Replica of log church constructed in 1836








St. Paul Mission in 1847, from a Father Point woodcut. The "ancient church" (No. 4) is the original long chapel of 1836.

In response to the requests for priests, the Bishop of Quebec, Bishop Joseph Signay, appointed Father Francois Norbert Blanchet as the Vicar General for the Oregon Country Missions. Father Blanchet and Father Modeste Demers, Father Blanchet's assistant, arrived at Fort Vancouver from Montreal with a Hudson's Bay Company group on November 24, 1838. Because it was the policy of the Hudson's Bay Company that priests could not reside south of the Columbia River, Father Blanchet planned to go as a visitor to the church on French Prairie, where the settlers and Indians were waiting for him. In early January, after the people on French Prairie had been advised that Father Blanchet would be arriving at the church, Etienne Lucier and Pierre Belleque from French Prairie went to Fort Vancouver to meet Father Blanchet and accompany him to French Prairie. They arrived back at the church on January 5, 1839.

On January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany, Father Blanchet blessed the French Prairie church and celebrated the first Mass south of the Columbia River in the Oregon Country. He dedicated the church, which was located in the midst of the farms, to the Apostle Paul. He then set about baptizing and marrying the settlers and their wives and baptizing their children. Almost all of the French Canadian-Indian families in the area were there. The day was unusually warm for that time of year, which the Indians considered a good omen. A new dimension had been added to the lives of the people in the St. Paul area.

May the branches of this tree continue to grow with strength and grace.

Let us remember whence we came, the cast of players that should not be forgotten.

But for a moment, they have been brought back to life.
