Mrs. Amelia Clemens at her farm home near Forest Grove is anticipating the visit of "Old Ironsides" with a different feeling of affection than most of us. Her father, William Johnson, Champcoog voter and builder of the first cabin on what is now Portland, was a sailor on the frigate when it clashed with the Guerriere. He was wounded in the fighting which resulted in Old Ironsides' famous victory. Mrs. Clemens is now 89.

FIRST BRICK HOUSE BUILT IN OREGON IN 1843 NOW SERVES AS SHELTER FOR YAMHILL SHEEP

Structure Put Up by George Gay, Early Adventurer and Settler, Used as Markers in Determining Boundary Lines of County; Builder "Useful Member of Society."



This, the first brick house built in Oregon, served as a home more than 20 years and now shelters sheep. It was erected in 1843 and the same year became incorporated into the law of that land by being donated to a point in the south boundary of Yamhill County.

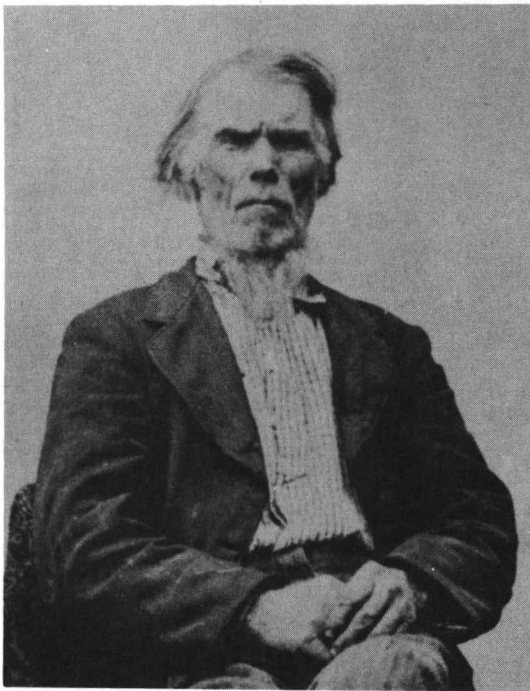

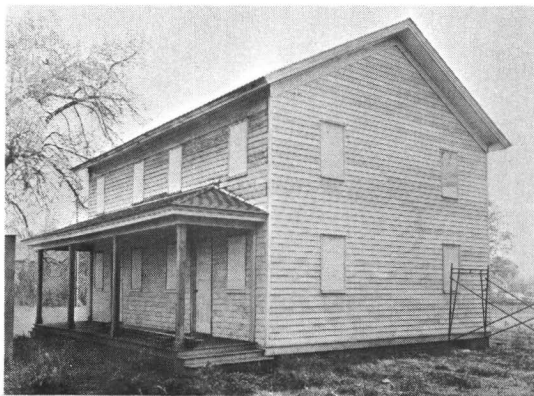

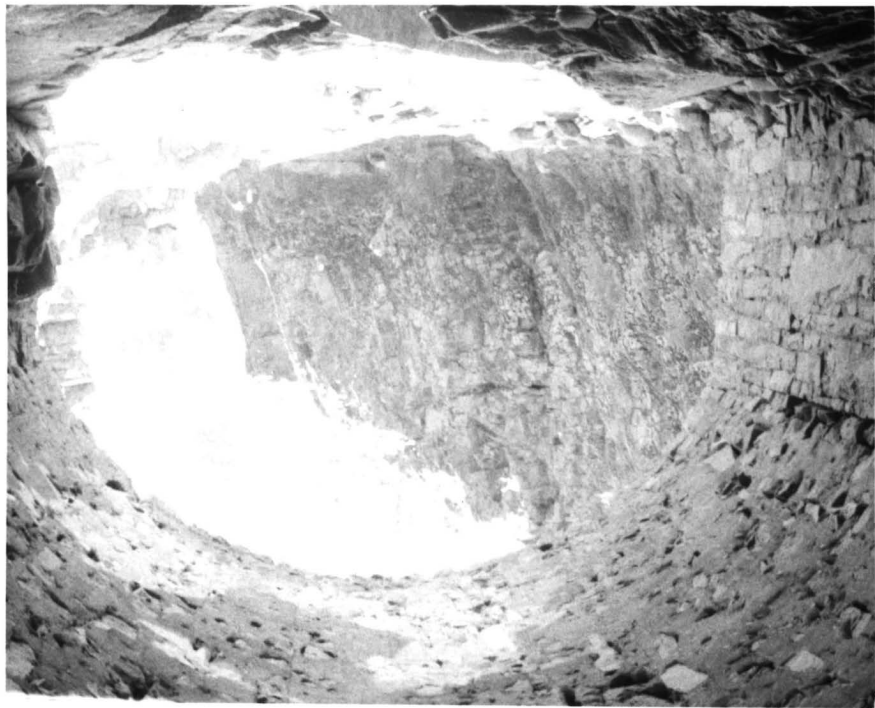
