CONFERENCE CURRICULUM

Through assignments to the ongoing program at the AHRC Training Center and Workshop, the Conference will focus on the philosophy, principles, and techniques in the rehabilitation of the mentally retarded. Emphasis will be placed on the role of the sheltered workshop as a major resource in a total community rehabilitation program. Students will be assigned to specific trainees under AHRC staff supervision, with opportunities for active participation in the vocational evaluation, individual and group counseling, job training, and other aspects of the Center program.

Lectures and group discussions at Teachers College will supplement the assignments to the AHRC Center.

The curriculum will include but not be limited to the following aspects of rehabilitation:

- Identification of the mentally retarded incidence, social, emotional psychological and vocational problems. Services required.
- Rehabilitation of the mentally retarded—a community responsibility.
- Sheltered workshops—history, philosophy, organization, operation.
- Rehabilitation techniques case finding, evaluation, counseling, job exploration, placement, follow-up.
- The role of the school—curriculum modification. Work-study program.
- The professional rehabilitation staff—selection, training, duties.

Selected rehabilitation facilities in the New York metropolitan area will be visited with opportunities for individual visits to other rehabilitation agencies.

Students will be expected to devote a full day to the Conference program.

ACADEMIC CREDIT

The Work Conference will be given as a course, TP3683S, in the Teachers College Summer Session. Students who meet the entrance requirements of Teachers College will receive two (2) credits for the Work Conference. Students may also enroll for the Work Conference as noncredit students.
