

Baseball team cops win from Dayton

After a three week layoff, the Ashland Eagles, swept a double-header from Dayton, Friday afternoon. The Eagles, behind the pitching of Randy Peddicord and Tom Wolford, took a pair of 1-0 decisions at Sarver Field on Good Friday.

Peddicord allowed only four hits, two walks, and struckout six for Ashland's first victory of the year. The Eagles got on the scoreboard in the second inning when right-fielder Chuck Littoral tripled and scored on Billy Groth's sacrifice fly.

Superb pitching was again the rule in the nightcap. Tom

Wolford hurled a one hitter after pitching four and two-thirds of no-hit ball to open the game. Billy Groth scored the lone run of the game in the seventh when he opened the frame with a single. Groth was sacrificed to second by Jeff Frank. Designated hitter Ralph Tomassi drew a walk and Tim Rupert reached first by way of an error to load the bases. Groth raced home when Jim Ray grounded into a forceout.

The Eagles traveled to Ohio University for a twinbill Saturday and caught Ohio U. with their hitting shoes on. Randy Fierbaugh allowed Ohio U. a

run in the first inning, three tallies in the third, and another run in the sixth frame. After the three run third, Fierbaugh settled down and kept many of the OU batters off balance with frequent change-ups.

In the second game of the doubleheader, the Eagles jumped off to a 3-0 lead as second-basemen Bill Florence singled with one out and Cliff followed with a homer. After two outs, Steve Ickes singled and Billy Groth doubled him in for the third run. But OU went to work in the fourth inning, scoring two runs off of starter Jerry May and Terry Lodico to

take a 12-3 win. Freshman Dave Kleck blanked OU the remaining two and one-third innings in relief to brighten up the Ashland pitching outlook.

Speedster Jimmy Ray swiped two bases over the weekend. Tom Wolford was named pitcher of the week with a 1.13 ERA and Tim Rupert's team leading .364 average helped him get hitter of the week, in awards handed out by the Red Barn. The Eagles traveled to Malone Tuesday for a doubleheader and will entertain Central State in a doubleheader at Sarver field beginning at 1 today.
