## Slipped disc causes pain

One out of every five persons suffers from back pain and one of every 100 of these sufferers needs surgery to correct the problem, usually a slipped disc. Now, says the December *Science Digest*, there is an experimental chemotherapy program that replaces the need for surgery and does a more effective job of correcting the back problem. After receiving injections of a chemical extract from the papaya plant, which dissolve the slipped disc without harming any other tissue, back pain sufferers recover in a matter of days and usually have permanent relief.
