## FUMBLES PAVE WAY FOR THREE TOUCHDOWNS

### Homecoming Crowd Sees Falcons Score In First Minute

Inability to hang on to the ball paved the way to Ashland's 20 to 0 loss to the Falcons of Bowling Green in the local homecoming event. Stopped short by a touchdown in the opening minute the Eagles trailed throughout the afternoon. Bowling Green scored on the first play that the ball was in their possession after Newell's fumble on Ashland's 39 where the ball rolled out of bounds. The touchdown play was a pass from Penton to Cheetwood on the 13 who galloped across for six points.

In the second quarter, after taking the ball on downs on the one yard stripe, an exchange of punts gave Ashland the ball on their own 7. Then another costly fumble gave Bowling Green possession of the ball on Ashland's seven yard stripe. Stewart, a boy who gave the Ashland tackles a lot of headaches, drove over left tackle for the score. Penton placekicked for the extra point.

The final tally followed Morrison's fumble on Ashland's 42. Stewart and Penton came down to the 32 for a first down. The same combination then plunged on through on the next three plays for another first down, this time on the twenty. Penton rounded left end for 10 yards and Inman scored on a reverse which netted about ten more. Penton's placement was again successful and the score stood at 20 to 0 at the game ended.

The total of fourteen fumbles proved to be the upset for the local eleven. Eight of the misplays were recovered by Bowling Green and were almost the margin of victory. Ashland played spotty ball with a few mighty fine flashes in the Eagles' favor. The starting eleven showed a need for plenty of brushing up for the Kent State encounter tomorrow.
