PROGRAM ON THE ARTS AND MENTAL HEALTH TO BE HELD AT THE DEPOT

The Mental Health Foundation, along with the Naples Institute, will present Awareness '81 at the Naples Depot starting with a reception for the keynote speaker, Dr. Bertram Brown, the evening of March 25th and continuing until noon on March 27th.

In past years the Foundation's Awareness program has revolved around panels and films on aging, alcoholism, parent/child relationships, drug abuse and stress in daily living. This year the format will focus on music and the arts, their relationship and influence on man, mental health and man's general well being. Special lectures, workshops and demonstrations by various musical and dance groups will be utilized.

Dr. Brown, former assistant surgeon of the U.S. and presently senior psychiatrist at the Rand Corporation in California, will be the keynote speaker and consultant for this program. Under his direction a 13 day seminar was held last year in Salzburg, Austria, bringing to-

gether artists from all over the world, many of whom were also mental health specialists. Their common bond was an interest in the expressive arts and a curiosity about how the arts affect people, whether as creators, performers or observers. During that seminar one participant noted that "Your body is an instrument . . . you must tune it." This is what the Foundation and the Naples Institute hope to present to the public on a smaller scale than that which was presented in Austria. The program, free to the public, is the Mental Health Foundation's way of giving something back to the public that generously supports the Foundation throughout the year with their fund raising projects.

The Naples Institute, through the generosity of Dr. Irving Cooper, is providing the Depot for the Awareness '81 program, as well as some of the musical groups that will perform, such as the ARS NOVA Woodwind Quartet of the University of South Florida. Additionally, a group from the University of Miami specializing in music therapy is expected to perform and local groups are being solicited to participate. One such group, specializing in jazz dancing, from the Naples Fine Arts Society will be performing at one of the workshops. The demonstration will take place at the Depot.


Classes resume on March 9th.
