PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Depot was saved and restored to bring beauty to an historic Naples landmark. At the same time it was envisioned by the Board of Southwest Heritage that a restored Depot could be of great service to Naples by providing much needed space for meetings and functions of the areas's cultural and civic groups.

While beauty has been achieved and being care for, it is important to note that the space provided for meetings and functions is being used beyond the expectations of many of us. This past month, for example, every day of the month, including Saturday and Sundays, was booked with from one to four events. Attendance at our events ranges from a dozen or more to over 400. That shows a purpose being achieved.

Along with the use of the Depot by civic and cultural groups there is some use by business groups for meetings of various purposes. A review of the bookings for January and February showed that there were 143 books, 68% civic and cultural groups, 32% business groups, weddings and private parties. These latter users of our facilities are, of course, asked to pay a higher rental fee than the civic and cultural users. Our aim is to keep the fees for such users as low as we can.

One associated with the Depot pauses from time to time in gratitude for the scores and scores of people who make possible the Depot's service to the community. One thinks of the Board of Directors, the users of the facilities, the corps of volunteers and the many citizens who have become Members.

Indeed, the Depot is the work of many hands and many hearts.

His topic will be "Strategic Planning: How to Get the Most out of the Defense Dollar," a review of how current defense costs became so astronomical and suggestions on how to insure maximum capability for each dollar.
