#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The sixth annual meeting of Southwest Heritage, Inc., held on March 9, was an especially buoyant one. This spirit was generated by the celebration of the Depot career of Richard P. Windisch, Director, the prime force in rallywing the Board to "save the Depot", our first treasurer, and protector of our fiscal life during the lean, early days, and generous donor and faithful in his attention to Dept. affairs. Mr. Windisch continues with the Depot as an Honorary Director.

The report of our treasurer, Edward J. Oates, Jr., encouraged us to act to reduce our rental fees for cultural, civic, non-profit groups by 5% beginning September, 1982. In this action Southwest Heritage is keeping a promise made during the capital fund drive. We promised, during those early months of our history, that we would keep rental fees for cultural and civic groups as low as possible in order to be of wider service to such groups in our city.

This step was made possible in great part by an increase in annual membership and, of course, by the strong support of the Depot's operation by the End of the Line Store.

We welcomed two new members to the Board of Directors, Mrs. Ruth Casey of the Naples Art Association and Dr. George L. Haller, retired General Electric executive and former Dean of Physics and Chemistry at Pennsylvania State University.

If there is a general good feeling about life and work at the Depot it springs from the kind of people gathered around its program: the Directors, the volunteers, and the members. These people come from a broad spectrum of backgrounds and interests, but there is a pervasive aura of good will that all share. I urge more of you to come, savor, and share.
