THE BEAUX ARTS BALL



COURTYARD, BAZAAR, TEMPLE

Courtyard, Bazaar, Temple: Productions of Textile Expressions in India, explores the cultural significance and regional diversity of textiles in India. This exhibition features 67 works of the 19th and 20th centuries and is on a national tour under the auspices of the Art Museum Association of America.

The exhibit in the Bradley Gallery is the second of the 1984-85 season. It is sponsored by the First National Bank and Trust Company of Naples, and is another example of the major fine art shows brought to Naples by Friends of Art, Inc.

The exhibition will be open to the public, free of charge from January 19 to February 9, 1985. Hours are Monday-Friday, 10-4, Saturday 11-3.



GULF COAST ORGAN CLUB


