AN ART EXHIBIT FROM THE SMITHSONIAN

Friends of Art is privileged to present "LA VIE PARI-SIENNE," a collection of etchings from Paris by internationally famous artist, Edgar Chahine. The exhibit was obtained from the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service.

The art of Edgar Chahine has a quality of disclosure quietly perceived and intently observed. His technical skill is revealed in the way the shadowy light of early morning or late evening touches the people and the architecture of the city. Chahine's individualistic style is not without roots, for it is part of the French tradition; this tradition both reinforces the artist's approach to his work, and assists in revealing the secrets of Paris.

The exhibit takes place in the Bradley Gallery and will be open to the public, free of charge, from February 21st through March 16th. Hours are Monday-Friday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

"Courtyard, Bazaar and Temple", an exhibit which explores the cultural significance and regional diversity of textiles in India, is currently on display and will remain through Saturday, February 9th. This exhibit is also open to the public at no charge.

The Horticultural Workshop on Monday, February 18th plans a trip to Fairchild Gardens, Miami and Allen Native Plant Nursery.




SWEETS FOR THE SWEET






