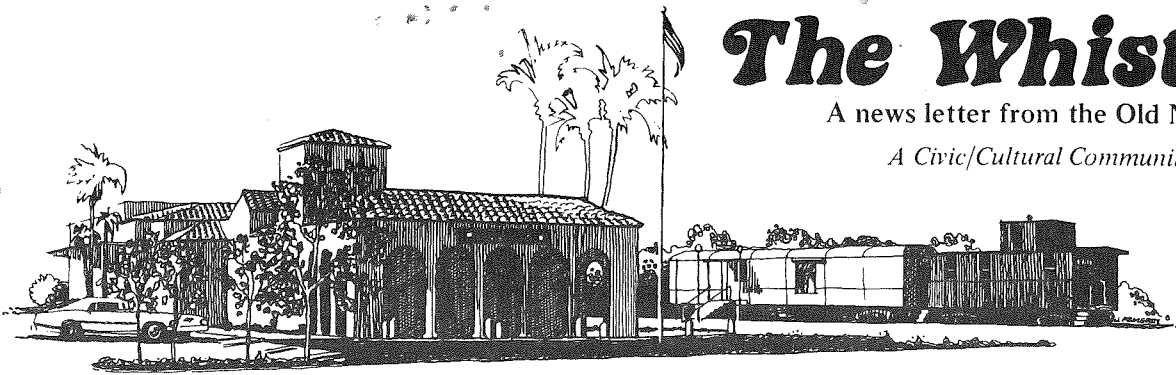

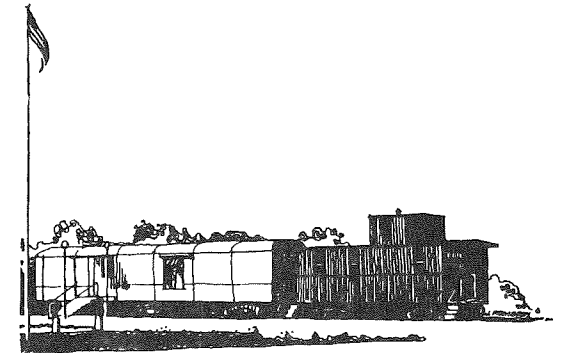
ZONTA INTERNATIONAL

The meeting is open to the public and is sponsored by the Barnett Bank of Naples.

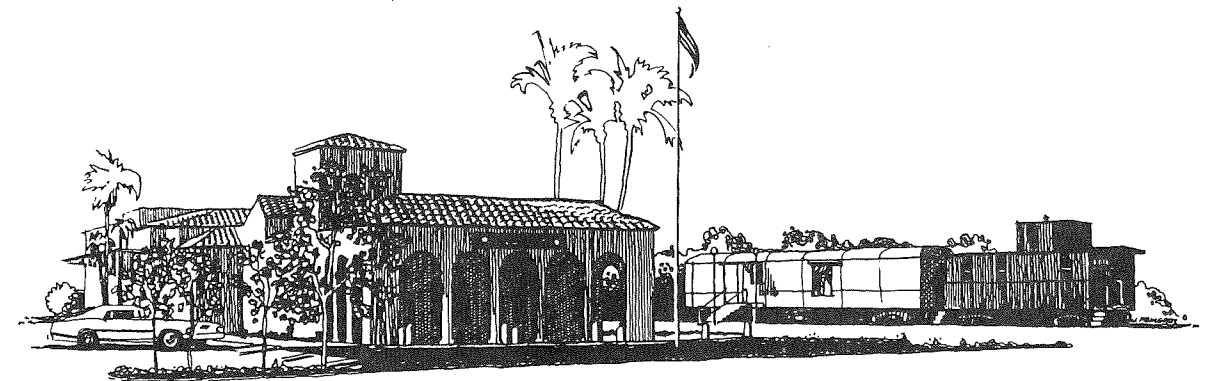


A SEMINAR ON INCONTINENCE

ART ASSOCIATION NEWS

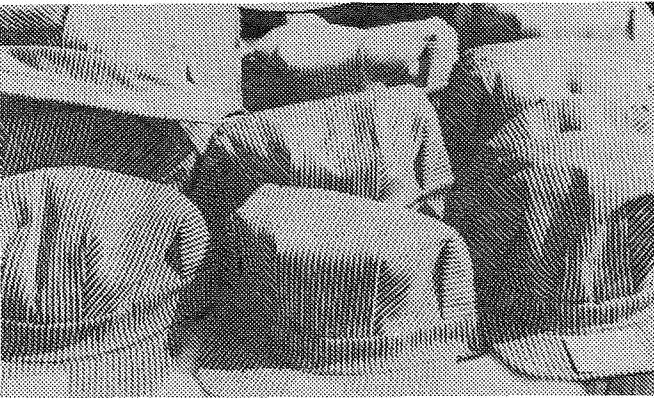
The Naples Art Association has scheduled two meetings in February. Both take place in the Norris Room at the Depot.

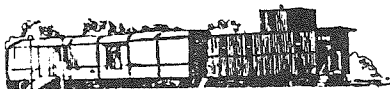
AMERICAN BUSINESS WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION
