In 1923, December 30, he accepted a position with the Barron Collier Interests at Everglades, Florida, as Comptroller and Public Accountant.


He is a member of the Lutheran Church, Naples Lions Club, Masons, and has served as Chairman of the War Finance Committee in Collier County during World War II.

The last picture was that of Marlene Allen who is still in college studying to become a surgical nurse.



In the third, fourth, fifth and sixth grades we tried many new experiments but very few worked. We did have a flower show in the fifth



This year we are really trying to settle down and work. Miss Spivey does not think so though.


