


IHS Starts Up




Fred Winters stands next to his chalk drawing of a winter fairy.

As sweet and innocent as she appears in this picture, Mrs. Ayer claims that, unlike her sister, she always did as she was told.


Having learned at an early age to dress to please his women, Mr. Ayer is shown here decked out for Easter in his best Sunday suit.

Mrs. Ayer was valedictorian of her high school class and was active in cheering, drama, and Honor Society. She then continued these activities in the role of a teacher.




Spirit has been an important part of the Ayer household for 15 years. This year, the football team threatened to eat Spirit if they won a game.






Hair is one thing that most students worry about. Maria Reyna decides to make a quick adjustment on her lunch break.




"During the day, I can be tired, but when it's time for the pep rally I'm full of energy," said Crystal Chance.








The freshmen had a 12-0 victory over the seniors. After JoAnne Gardner scored, Glorla Rosado, and Shanika Hughes congratulated her.





Queen Silvia Munoz said, "I was cold and nervous. When I heard my name called for queen, I jumped up


and my heel had gotten stuck in the ground. I was overwhelmed by the great news."































"I enjoy running and it's part of my exercise to get in shape for tennis," said Ms. Sprague, who organized Fun Run and Field Day.

"Eat my dust!" said Mrs. Edwardson, who was the first female to cross the finish line, proving that younger is not always faster.













Olga Augustin joined the team late in the season, but veteran Carolyn Dupree has been with the team for two years. Carolyn played offense and scored against Lely High.































Academic Awards


